Ms Nathalie Martin is a French national. She holds a Master II degree (DEA) in International Public Law from the University of Toulouse I.

Between 1999 and 2015, Ms Martin was a legal advisor for Amnesty International, France where she was responsible for issues related to international humanitarian law and its transposition within domestic law, international criminal tribunals, refugee law, the reform of the Criminal Procedure Law, and the consequences of serious forms of criminality, such as violence against women and trafficking in human beings, for the human rights of the victims. She also represented AI France in the working group in charge of proposing legislative and practical changes to improve the situation of victims of trafficking and the implementation of the Council of Europe Convention on Action against Trafficking in Human Beings by France.

Since 2015, Ms Martin has worked for the NGO *Amicale du Nid,* which is in charge of providing assistance to victims of human trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation. Ms Martin regularly provides training on issues related to human trafficking, the identification and assistance of victims to front-line actors such as police and gendarmerie officers and has assisted numerous victims of trafficking during criminal proceedings.

Ms Martin also teaches criminal law, international public law and administrative law at the University of Toulouse I, as well as intellectual property law at the University of Toulouse Jean-Jaurès. She is the author of publications on international legal mechanisms for the protection of human rights, refugee law and trafficking in human beings, action against violence against women, and migration and victims of human trafficking.

In 2015-2016, Ms Martin was engaged as an expert for the Council of Europe in projects in Tunisia and Morocco in the area of combating trafficking in human beings.
