<b>Partners and beneficiaries</b>	National Training Institutions (NTIs), BAs and universities, as well as legal professionals (judges, lawyers and prosecutors)
<b>Main objectives</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. To enhance the capacities of national training institutions and universities to provide effective training on the implementation of the related instruments and case-law through HELP methodology and tools.</li><li>2. To increase the knowledge and skills of legal and other professionals, as well as law students to effectively and coherently apply CoE legal requirements in their daily work and practice.</li></ol>
<b>Expected outputs and results</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. The HELP Network of national trainers, with representatives in most regions of the country, is well-established. National trainers are available to lead HELP distance courses and provide face-to-face learning to various groups of legal and non-legal professionals.</li><li>2. The HELP Human Rights training methodology is implemented at national level and existing HELP training materials are incorporated into the NTIs/BAs curricula.</li><li>3. HELP blended/distance learning courses, according to the needs of national partners, are developed, adapted, tested and made available to the NTIs/BAs.</li><li>4. The CoE standards and legal instruments are introduced and incorporated into the universities' curricula as an integral part of the Russian legal system.</li></ol> <p>The Project benefits from the existing HELP Network and applies the <a href="#">HELP Human Rights training methodology for legal professionals</a>.</p>
