

Around 1/3 of all inmates

New admissions per year doubled from 2006 (1,436) to 2011 (2,730)

Peak at 2,810 in 2009

From 114 different countries in 2011

53 % of preliminary custody admissions

Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Iraq



- Not signed FD 909 (yet)




Special prison for sentenced foreign nationals with extradition measure
