

# Background + objectives of the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Drafting Committee

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### **Background**:

- In April 2016 the GEC agreed to prepare a draft Rec. on combating sexism for submission to the CM (GE Strategy 2014-2017, Obj. 1 "combat gender stereotypes and sexism")
- The GEC instructed the Secretariat to take the necessary action incl. relevant expertise in MS and involving other CoE sectors
- Brainstorming meeting on 15 Nov. 2016
- In Nov. 2016, the GEC agreed that 15 MS would participate in the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Drafting Committee in March 2017

### Background (cont.):

- Informal brainstorming in Nov. 2016 Need to:
  - review relevant CoE materials/standards
  - discuss **consultations** on draft Rec (GMT, etc.)
  - focus on sexist actions, their origin + impact
  - cover sexism in public/private and language
    - no distinction between ordinary+violent sexism
  - include/refer to good practices in MS
  - focus on exemplary role of public authorities
  - address intersectionality
  - be concrete, practical, operational/add value...



# Background (cont.):

- The GEC agreed (in Nov. 2016) that the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Drafting Committee should:
  - discuss a definition of sexism
  - explore the links between sexism,
     discrimination and violence
  - identify the tools needed to address sexism
  - No set deadline for this work to be included in GEC's Terms of Reference for 2018-2019 (also the Drafting Committee)



# Objectives of the meeting:

- Discuss possible elements for a definition of sexism, on the basis of existing standards and experience in member states
- Get input from experts on how to address the links between sexism, sex-based discrimination and violence against women
- Review a preliminary draft outline of the Rec. focusing on both structure and content
- Decide on next steps to prepare the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Draft. Committee (June 2017)



# CoE Gender Equality Strategy 2014-2017

#### **Five objectives:**

- 1. combating gender stereotypes and sexism;
- 2. preventing and combating VaW;
- 3. guaranteeing equal access to justice;
- 4. achieving balanced <u>participation in political</u> and <u>public decision-making</u>;
- 5. achieving gender mainstreaming in all policies and measures.

#### This work is central to all of them:

- 1: Combating gender stereotypes and sexism, includes <u>sexist hate speech</u> (previous CoE work on <u>gender stereotypes in media + education</u>)
- 2: Prevent and combat violence against women: stalking, bullying, sexual harassment, threats...
- 3: Balanced participation of women and men in decision-making: sexism and women in power
- 4: Women's access to justice: measures needed to provide victims of sexism with redress
- 5: Gender mainstreaming of all CoE policies, (intersectionality, Media and Internet Governance)
