Summary

The Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention is aimed at: 1. Monitoring implementation of the Convention; 2. Fostering international co-operation; 3. Collecting examples of good practice; 4. Promoting knowledge and research for policy development; 5. Increasing awareness-raising; and 6. Enabling access to information.

1. Monitoring the implementation of the Convention

Committee of Experts set up under the Council of Europe's Statute

The Convention provides that existing competent committees of experts, set up under the Council of Europe's Statute, shall be designated by the Council of Europe's Committee of Ministers to be responsible for monitoring its implementation (Article 10). Since 2012, the Steering Committee for Culture, Heritage and Landscape (CDCPP) has been entrusted with the implementation of the Convention. It examines in particular the results of the work of the Council of Europe Conferences on the European Landscape Convention. The Secretary General of the Council of Europe forwards a report on the work carried out and on the operation of the Convention to the Committee of Ministers.

Council of Europe Conferences on the European Landscape Convention

Held since 2001 and mentioned in the terms of reference of the CDCPP, the biennial Council of Europe <u>Conferences</u> on the European Landscape Convention enable progress to be made on implementing its Chapter II (National Measures) and III (European Cooperation). They aim, in synergy with CDCPP, to exchange information on the way in which Parties to the Convention are implementing it, to monitor progress, to report to parties on work done in the framework of the Convention, to make proposals for a more effective implementation of the Convention, and to discuss and adopt its strategic lines and programme of activities, following Article 8 of the Convention on "Mutual assistance and exchange of information".

Landscape Observatory: the European Landscape Convention Information System of the Council of Europe and its glossary

The <u>Council of Europe Information System on the European Landscape Convention</u> allows for online access to information about the policies developed in order to implement the European Landscape Convention at national and regional level. The <u>Glossary</u> clarifies certain terms used. <u>Recommendation CM/Rec(2013)4</u> of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe invites States Parties to the Convention to make use of this Information System and its Glossary in the context of their co-operation, to work together on developing it further, and to continue to exchange information on all the matters covered by the provisions of the Convention, in order to promote an awareness of landscapes and the policies relating to them.

Legal and technical expertise

Legal and technical expertise is provided to States wishing to sign/ratify/accede or implement the European Landscape Convention. Meetings concerning one or more States are also organised at national, regional or local level (Seminars).

2. Fostering international co-operation

The Council of Europe organises this co-operation through the Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention and other meetings organised at national, regional or local level.

Council of Europe Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

Organised by the Council of Europe on a regular basis since 2002, the Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention are intended to deepen certain issues of the Convention. A genuine forum for sharing practice and ideas, the Meetings are also an opportunity to present new concepts and achievements under the Convention. Special emphasis is given to the experiences of the state hosting the meeting.

Transfrontier co-operation

The Convention states that the Parties shall encourage transfrontier co-operation at a local and regional level and, wherever necessary, prepare and implement joint landscape programmes (Article 9). The work carried out supports the application of this provision.

International co-operation

The European Landscape Convention provides that the contracting parties undertake to co-operate internationally in the consideration of the landscape dimension of international policies and programmes (Article 8). Considering that the Convention promotes a synergy between the themes of sustainable development (environmental, social, economic and cultural), democracy, human rights and the rule of law, particular attention is paid to its contribution to world debates on Sustainable Development (United Nations Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development) and Habitat.

Working Groups on the European Landscape Convention

The <u>Working groups</u> aim to prepare draft recommendations or resolutions to the attention of the Committee of Ministers.

3. Collecting examples of good practice: the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe

Sessions of the Council of Europe Landscape Award:

The Convention provides for a "Council of Europe Landscape Award" (Article 11). It recognises a policy implemented or measures to be taken by local and regional authorities or non-governmental organisations to protect, manage and/or plan their landscape which have proved effective in the long term and can thus serve as an example to other authorities in Europe. The Sessions of the Landscape Award are organised according to the Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe.

Council of Europe Landscape Award Forums of National Selections

Organised by the Council of Europe on a regular basis since 2012, the Council of Europe Landscape Award Forums of National Selections (Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention) allow presenting the national selections for the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe. The Ceremony of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe is held on this occasion.

Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe http://www.coe.int/en/web/landscape/landscape-award-alliance

The <u>Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe</u> gathers the exemplary achievements presented by the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention. They show that it is possible to promote the territorial dimension of human rights and democracy by improving the landscape features of people's surroundings.

4. Promoting knowledge and research for policy development

Thematic exploratory reports on issues related to the European Landscape Convention are drawn up by Council of Europe experts and submitted to the relevant committees of experts. They aim to analyse different aspects of the implementation of the Convention that may permit draft recommendations to be prepared.

5. Increasing awareness-raising

Promotion of exhibitions, landscape events, publications and films.

6. Enabling access to information

The Committee is invited to:

- take note of the activities of the European Landscape Convention carried out in 2017 in accordance with the Work Programme and Action Plan for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention 2017-2019, as adopted by the 9th Council of Europe Conference on the European Landscape Convention on 24 March 2017 (Appendix 10 to the <u>Report</u>: CEP-CDCPP (2017) 19E);
- decide on the composition of the Working Group of the European Landscape Convention "Rights and responsibilities for everyone" and designate its Members as mentioned in the note below.

Note: Considering that the Conceptual Report for reference on "Landscape and the European Landscape Convention's contribution to democracy, human rights and sustainable development" (CEP-CDCPP (2017) 5E rev.) deals with human rights, the Working Group will focus on the concept of responsibility from an ethical perspective. It will identify the main actors of the landscape, as well as tools to promote the protection, management and planning of the landscape.

Activities will start in autumn 2017 and will continue in 2018. The Working Group will be composed of five government representatives and two representatives of non-governmental organisations.
