Motivation

I am currently Vice-Chair of the Democracy, Social Cohesion and Global Challenges Committee, a Public Health Inspector and very active in civil society. The INGO that I represent and chair was granted consultative, and then participatory, status by the Council of Europe 40 years ago.

The last three years have been eventful and productive, in view of the variety of contributions made and the ties we have established with the other pillars of the Council. In particular, we intervened during the COP21 and we were behind a recommendation by the Conference on the care and the fundamental rights of older persons, many points of which were taken up in a Parliamentary Assembly document.
