Within the framework of the Eurimages' Cinema Support Scheme, applications from Urania National Cinema Palace, Budapest (Hungary) and Kinoteka, Zagreb (Croatia) were accepted in the network on a purely retroactive basis from 1 January 2003.

In addition, two cinemas in Turkey and Romania were appointed as 'pilot sites' for the project of digital subtitling which will be one of the elements of the planned Touring Week of European Film (2004).

EURIMAGES is a support fund for co-production, distribution and exhibition of European cinematographic works, established by the Council of Europe in 1988¹ (E-mail : Eurimages@coe.int - Web : <http://www.coe.int/Eurimages>). Since its establishment, EURIMAGES has supported 948 European co-productions for a total amount of 268 838 060 Euros.

¹ Since 1 July 2003, EURIMAGES comprises 29 member States: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey
