In the framework of the distribution support programme, Scheme I (Support for marketing and publicity costs), the Board has granted its support to 22 Films released between 1 June and 30 September 2014. The total support granted represents €123 397.

With regard to the Digital Support Programme, which will be discontinued at the end of this year, the last support was granted by the Board to the Dom Kino theatre (Saratov, Russian Federation).

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EURIMAGES is a support fund for cinema co-production, theatrical distribution, exhibition and digital equipment for cinema theatres established by the Council of Europe in 1988 (Eurimages@coe.int - http://www.coe.int/Eurimages).

Since it was set up in 1988, EURIMAGES has supported 1634 European co-productions for a total amount of approximately 496 million euros.
