HELLENIC REPUBLIC MINISTRY OF CITIZENS' PROTECTION HELLENIC POLICE

As regards the incident in question, we would like to inform you that the Hellenic Police acted in full compliance with the Greek law and judicial orders.

More specifically, on 09.04.2017, Ms. Stavroula Nikolopoulou filed a complaint for libel against Mr. Konstantinos Vaxevanis at the Police Station of Kallithea.

The Head of the Prosecution Department of the Public Prosecutor's Office at the Athens Court of First Instance was immediately informed of the case.

The Prosecutor considered the offence as "libel committed through the press" and ordered the arrest of the journalist.

On 10.04.2017, Mr. Vaxevanis presented himself voluntarily at the Police Station of Kallithea and, following this, he was taken to the Public Prosecutor at the Athens Court of First Instance.
