Purchase of Intellectual Services



The Council of Europe is currently implementing the Project to End Online Child Sexual Exploitation and Abuse @ Europe VC1840 as well as Projects on Protecting children from sexual exploitation and sexual abuse in the Republic of Moldova and Responding to Child sexual exploitation and abuse in Georgia, phase I. (the Projects). In that context, it is recruiting Provider(s) for the provision of intellectual services to strengthen and develop training materials, programmes and strategies available to law enforcement agencies regarding child-friendly practices and e-evidence in relation to Online Child Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (OCSEA) in selected countries, as requested by the Council on an as needs basis (See Section A of the Act of Engagement).

A. TENDER RULES

This tender procedure is a restricted consultation procedure. In accordance with Rule 1333 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between €2,000 (or €5,000 for intellectual services) and €55,000 tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **one-off contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Act of Engagement (See attached). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. Each lot will be awarded to the Provider providing the best value for money for the lot concerned, on the basis of the award criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be either a natural person, or a duly registered company under sole proprietorship of a natural person, or equivalent, provided that the signatory of the Act of Engagement is individually liable for all obligations undertaken by the entity, and is the owner of the moral rights in any creations of the entity. If contracted by the Council of Europe, the signatory of the Act of Engagement shall provide the deliverables personally, in accordance with the terms as provided in the present Tender File and Act of Engagement.

- the fee per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

D. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Act of Engagement, you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations)² Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are or are likely to be in a situation of conflict of interests.

Eligibility criteria

- University degree, in law, political or social science, or other relevant professional qualification, with proven experience, knowledge and practical understanding of the international standards in the area of OCSEA;
- Proven knowledge and experience of at least two of the following areas: investigation of OCSEA, electronic evidence, safeguarding children, victim identification in the context of OCSEA, transborder co-operation and co-operation with stakeholders at national level.
- Minimum of 3 years professional experience working in an area related to OCSEA at national or international level;
- Ability to work in an international environment;
- Demonstrated drafting and writing skills in English;
- Availability to speak at relevant events (exact location, dates and times to be agreed).

Award criteria
