1. Please state the reason of your complaint (refer also the Contracting Party/es involved and the Articles of the Convention which might be violated).

BirdLife Norway wish to report the lack of legal protection for Northern Goshawk and other birds of prey in Norway, due to a change in the national legislation. The aim of the Bern Convention is to "ensure conservation of wild flora and fauna species and their habitats", with special concern to vulnerable and endangered species, including some specified migratory species. Strictly protected fauna species are listed under Annex II of the Convention. Included in Annex II are all diurnal birds of prey and owls (Council of Europe 1979). We believe that the Norwegian legislation is a violation of the Bern Convention article 9, point 1.

2. Which are the specific specie/s or habitat/s included in one of the Appendices of the Bern Convention potentially affected? (Please include here information about the geographical area and the population of the species concerned, if applicable)

Northern Goshawk, other birds of prey and carnivores in Norway.

3. What might be the negative effects for the specie/s or habitat/s involved?

These species can be killed/shot, even in situations where there are other options. Under the present national regulation and interpretation by the courts, BirdLife Norway point to the fact that any bird of prey may now be killed under the pretext of attack on domestic livestock. What constitutes an attack may easily be is misinterpreted or misused, and may be an easy excuse to use when removing birds of prey in an area.

4. Do you know if potentially affected species or habitats also fall under the scope of other international Conventions, (for instance: RAMSAR, CMS, ACCOBAMS, Barcelona Convention, etc) or if the area has been identified as a NATURA 2000/Emerald network site?

Northern Goshawk is also included in Annex II of the Bonn Convention.

5. Do you know if there are any pending procedures at the national or international level regarding the object of your complaint?

The Government Committee for Energy and the Environment discussed a proposition to amend the Nature Diversity Act (administrative exemptions and confiscations) on 18th October 2016. However, the ministry decided not no forward a motion to change Section 2, subsection 2 of the Nature Diversity Act.
