BACKGROUND

The Belarus Project on "Good governance and fight against corruption" was part of the overall CoE/EU Partnership for Good Governance (PGG) Programme "Fight against corruption and fostering good governance; Fight against money-laundering" assistance facility to the Eastern Partnership countries. It was one of the National Components primarily focused on strengthening efforts aimed at preventing and fighting corruption.

NEEDS, OBJECTIVES, EXPECTED RESULTS AND ACTIVITIES

The **overall objective** of the PGG-BE project was to contribute to democracy and the rule of law through strengthening of good governance and anti-corruption mechanisms. Accordingly, the PGG-BE aimed at strengthening institutional capacities to prevent and counter corruption in Belarus, in accordance with applicable European standards. Due to the small scale of the Project, activities were developed to address discrete but specific issues, following country needs and priorities as well as the European Union Council Conclusions on Belarus (October 2012). The Project accordingly focused on:

- Prevention: risk assessments; and
- **Enforcement:** strengthening the capacities of criminal justice institutions to investigate and prosecute corruption.

In line with the above, the Project achieved the following:

- Expected Result 1: Selected sectors of public governance reviewed for corruption (risk assessments); and
- Expected Result 2: Capacities of authorities to prevent, investigate, prosecute and adjudicate corruption and economic crime cases enhanced.

Assistance activities planned in both areas included assessments, provision of expert advice, workshops, trainings, and roundtables. The activity results have been documented in technical papers, handbooks, or other **written output** which are available on the Project website.
