# Official statistics – advantages and disadvantages



- Advantages
  - every country collects crime data
  - stability within countries in recording procedures
- Disadvantages
  - police data are not comprehensive measure of crime (dark number)
  - difficulties in comparison across countries due to many differentiations (laws, practices, reporting)

### **Critical questions**



- When are data collected (when reported to the police i.e. input, or when police completes investigation i.e. output)?
- What is the counting unit?
- Is principle offence rule applied?
- How are serial offences counted?
- How is offence committed by more than one person reported?
- Include and exclude categories give further instruction regarding each offence


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#### Other observations

#### **Homicide (completed)**









#### Rape

- 98.6 % of suspects men (range 95-100 %)
- 9.9 % of suspects were minors (range 4.7-24.1 %)
- 8.7 % of suspects were foreigners (range 0.3-51.5 %)
  - 35.6 of them were from EU member states

- Trends in recorded crime and offenders vary by type of offence and by countries
- Police statistics reflect a variety of different things: different priorities, strategies, available resource, levels of trust in police and differences in reporting the crimes to police
