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Magna Charta Universitatum

- Signed by 388 rectors in Bologna on 18 September 1988
- Now 662 signatories in 78 countries
- Fundamental principles and values

 Institutional autonomy
 - Academic freedom
 - Link between teaching and research

Magna Charta Observatory

- Founded in 2001 by University of Bologna and European Rectors Conference (now EUA)
- Based at the University of Bologna
- No membership

- Think tank
