


I. Raise awareness activities

✓ Strengthen further collaboration with judicial and lawenforcement institutions








Problem:

- Conseil de l'Europe Convention Médicrime
- Addressed to Legal professionals (judges, prosecutors)
- Co-operation with HELP Project
 - Support CoE MS in implementing ECHR at national level
- 2013 HELP Conference: the MEDICRIME Convention part of
 - Initial training
 - Continuous training



Guinea ratified on 24 September 2015

 5th Party to MEDICRIME Convention
 (Other countries having ratified: Ukraine, Spain, Hungary, Moldova)

– Entry into force: 1 January 2016
