What is the PSS+'s background?



- Joint programme of the Council of Europe and the European Commission
- Implemented by the Council of Europe / Enlarged Partial Agreement on Sport (EPAS)
- > Follows the « Pro Safe Sport » project aimed at promoting a safe and healthy environment for young athletes (2014-2015)
- In line with standards and norms set up by the Council of Europe, mainly:
 - → The Convention on protection of children against sexual exploitation and sexual abuse (Lanzarote Convention, 2007)

What are its objectives?



PSS+ calls for a <u>renewed political attention</u> and for the <u>development of policies and measures</u> to prevent and combat sexual violence against children in sport

Increasing the commitment of public authorities and non-governmental sport organisations towards this topic

Through...

<u>awareness raising</u> and <u>capacity building</u> resources

What are its objectives?



- 2 target groups:
 - National public authorities (Ministries / government departments)
 - Sport organisations
- More than 10 experts and partners involved in PSS+

Why is it being run?



5 main arguments:

- Sexual harassment and abuse: widespread violations of children's human dignity and rights
- > A taboo subject in the field of sport
- The relevance of a European approach
- > A highly topical issue of major importance
- ➤ A lack of policies and strategic actions in Europe for preventing and combating gender-based violence in sport

An online resource centre on sexual violence against children in sport:



PURPOSE

Twofold approach:

Internal dimension

- Exchange of information on practices, policies and research (peer-learning)
- Collection of new resources
- Making recommendations / suggestions to the European institutions

External action

Expertise on demand to interested organisations (peer-support)






