## The objective, purpose and funding of the project

## Who benefitted:

- Objective: To contribute to the development of democracy and the rule of law in the Kyrgyz Republic through implementation of anti-corruption measures and policies;
- Purpose: Strengthen the capacities of the Kyrgyz authorities to prevent and fight corruption;
- Total budget: EURO 555,556.00, of which European Union
  90%; Council of Europe 10%;
- *Length*: 24 months, from 30 July 2016 to 29 July 2018;
- The project's EU funds come from the Financing Agreement "Promotion of the respect of Rule of Law in Kyrgyzstan with particular emphasis on Transparency and Accountability" number DCI-ASIE/2012/021-178, signed on 21 September 2013 in Brussels;
- The project was implemented by Directorate General Human Rights and Rule of Law-DG I, Action against Crime Department, Economic Crime and Cooperation Division, Council of Europe.

## Milestones and results:

- A first of its kind anti-corruption legislation review in light of international and European standards in the field;
- Pools of trainers specialised on corruption proofing, anticorruption investigations, ethics and conflict of interest for civil servants and, separately, for law enforcement agencies;
- Trained law enforcement officials and civil servants on corruption and economic crimes investigations, corruption proofing of legislation, corruption measurement, as well as coordination and oversight of corruption and economic crimes investigations;
- A corruption measurement methodology;
- Guidelines on managing asset declarations;
- A blue-print for an anti-corruption communication strategy;
- Guidelines on improving the coordination and oversight of corruption and economic crimes investigations.





- General Prosecutor's Office;
- Anti-corruption Council of the Government and the Department to Prevent Corruption;

## How did the project work?

- All activities were carried out in close cooperation with authorities, which entailed indepth and participatory consultations;
- For a full delivery cycle, evaluations were followed up by Council of Europe expertise and knowledge transfer; needs assessments have been followed through with trainings and ToTs, accompanied by training handbooks;
- Overall, during its lifespan, the project implemented 25 activities and delivered 16 technical papers;
- A total of 505 participants (29% women and 71% men) took part in and benefited from project's activities.
