43rd meeting of the Bureau

Geneva, 18-20 December 2017

ABRIDGED REPORT

Directorate General of Human Rights and Rule of Law

The Bureau of the Consultative Committee of the Convention for the Protection of Individuals with regard to Automatic Processing of Data ("Convention 108") held its 43rd meeting in Geneva from 18 to 20 December 2017 with Ms Alessandra Pierucci (Italy) in the chair. The agenda, as adopted by the Bureau and the list of participants are set out in Appendices I and II.

The Bureau of the Committee of Convention 108:

- 1. took note of the information presented by the Secretariat regarding the latest developments and in particular regarding the budgetary situation of the Organisation as of 2018 and the invitation made to the United Mexican States to accede to Convention 108 and to its additional Protocol (13 December 2017);
- 2. took note of the information concerning the **modernisation of Convention 108** at the level of the Group of Rapporteurs on Legal Co-operation (GR-J meeting of 11 December 2017) and Committee of Ministers (meeting of 13 December 2017);
- 3. examined the draft recommendation on the protection of **health-related data** presented by the Secretariat, held an exchange of views and decided that the draft would be revised in light of these discussions and sent for comments to the Committee on Bioethics (DH-BIO) and Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) in view of a final review of the draft by the Bureau, together with the draft explanatory memorandum, at its next meeting;
- 4. examined the draft "Privacy and Data protection principles **guide for ICANN** related data processing" presented by the Secretariat, held an exchange of views and decided that the draft would be revised in light of these discussions and circulated to the participants for final comments before being submitted to adoption by written procedure, underlining the importance of delivering this guidance rapidly;
- 5. took note of the information provided by the Secretariat regarding the Committee's **work programme** for the 2018-2019 biennium in view of its implementation, in particular regarding the preparation of a report on artificial intelligence, the work related to ICANN and the draft Guidelines on safeguarding privacy in the media;
- 6. took note of the activities and major developments related to the work of the Committee, in particular the Council of Europe's participation in the Internet Governance Forum (IGF, Geneva, 18 21 December 2017) and in the Computers, Privacy & Data Protection Conference" (CPDP, Brussels, 24 26 January 2018);
- 7. took note of the information on the **co-operation with other Council of Europe bodies**, in particular the work of the Cybercrime Committee (T-CY), calling for the Consultative Committee of Convention 108 to be formally involved in the process of preparation of the second additional protocol to the Budapest Convention and to be consulted on the proposals early enough in the process. It also took note of the participation of a member of the Bureau (France) in the work on predictive justice of the Working Group on quality of the Commission on the Efficiency of Justice (CEPEJ);
- 8. took note of the information presented by the **observers**, namely by the ICRC on its participation in the IGF and in the CPDP, by Europol on the change of the legal framework governing its activities and the first data protection investigation carried out under this framework, as well as of the organisation by Europol of the conference "1984 unplugged" on 21-22 November 2018, by the CNDP of Morocco on the organisation of an international conference on 22 February 2018 in Casablanca and of the Network of African DPAs on 23 February 2018, and by Privacy International regarding its latest work on safeguards against government hacking, to be launched at the Privacy Camp in Brussels on 23 January 2018;
- 9. confirmed the date of the next Bureau meeting, to be held from 26 to 28 March 2018 in Paris and the Plenary meeting to be held in Strasbourg from 19 to 21 June 2018.
