A. MEDALS

Austria

KREMS for the excellent and comprehensive restoration of the historic quarters of the town.

Federal Republic of Germany

SCHWABACH for the creation of a fine pedestrian area and underground car-park in the market square.

Netherlands

AMSTERDAM for the admirable restoration and modernisation of a continuing series of old buildings.

Spain

SAN LORENZO DE EL ESCORIAL for the fine restoration of the ancient theatre - Real Coliseo de Carlos III.

United Kingdom

JEDBURGH for the superb rehabilitation of the town centre and adaptation of old buildings to new uses.

B. DIPLOMAS

Austria

GRAZ for the comprehensive restoration and revitalisation of the city centre and the creation of pedestrian areas.

BAD MÜHLACKEN for the skilful design of a new hotel in the countryside which respects the rural character of its surroundings.

Belgium

BRUGES for the comprehensive restoration and revitalisation of the historic city centre.

NAMUR for the fine restoration of buildings in an ancient quarter of the city and their adaptation to new uses.

France

AVIGNON for the admirable rehabilitation of the Palace of the Popes and the creation of a congress centre with underground car-park.

TROYES for the fine restoration of the ancient quarter of St. Jean and the creation of a pedestrian area.

Federal Republic of Germany

BAD REICHENHALL for the extensive diversion of traffic in the city centre and the creation of a beautiful garden area.

DUSSELDORF for the comprehensive reconstruction of the Rheinhalle to provide a fine concert hall.

EICHSTATT for the completion of the first of eight sectors of the old town which are being extensively restored and renovated.

KIRBERG for the fine restoration of a notable 16th century building and internal adaptation to present-day requirements.

WINTERBACH for the admirable restoration of the ancient town centre and the conversion of buildings for civic uses.

Greece

ISLAND OF SANTORINI for the superb rehabilitation of the old village of Oia to form a tourist area, while preserving its existing character.

Ireland

DUBLIN for the construction of a group of modern houses which harmonise well with their older neighbours.

Italy

STERZING for the fine restoration of the Town Hall and the creation of a pedestrian area.

VENICE for the superb restoration of the 15th century Porta della Carta, the principal entrance to the Doge's Palace.

Malta

VALLETTA for the superb restoration of the Sacred Infirmary of the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem and its adaptation for use as a Mediterranean Conference Centre.

Netherlands

VORDEN for the admirable restoration of the old castle and its conversion for use as the Town Hall.

WILLEMSTAD for the fine restoration of a 16th century building and its adaptation for use as the Town Hall.

Sweden

MALMÖ for the restoration of buildings and courtyards in the ancient quarter of St. Gertrud to provide a centre for leisure activities.

STOCKHOLM for the excellent restoration of Fersen Palace and its conversion for use as a bank.

Switzerland

SION for the comprehensive restoration of the old town and the creation of pedestrian areas.

ST. GALLEN for the admirable restoration of old buildings in the town centre and the conversion of the Convent of St. Katharine into a library.

Turkey

ISTANBUL for the excellent restoration of the Malta Pavilion and its adaptation for use of public receptions and conferences.

United Kingdom

ASHBY DE LA ZOUCHE for the skilful restoration of 18th century buildings and their adaptation for use as shops.

ISLE OF BARRA for the admirable design of a new hotel which harmonises well with the rugged coastline and countryside.

FRASERBURGH for the comprehensive redevelopment of the town centre in harmony with the character, scale and texture of existing buildings.

LEEDS for the fine restoration of a notable Victorian building in the city centre and adaptation for use as offices.

WHITE HORSE HILL for the creation of a well-designed visitors' car-park, discreetly sited with due regard for the famous view.
