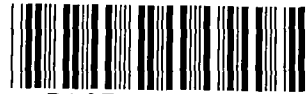

M E D A L S

- DENMARK Wosborg - 'Nørre Wosborg Castle' - for the exemplary restoration of the ancient castle and farm buildings.
- GERMANY Trier - for the superb rebuilding of a war-damaged church, and harmonious additions, for use as a school and cultural activities.
- ITALY Venice - 'Palazzo Bollani' - for the excellent restoration of a dilapidated college building.
- SPAIN Mirambel - for the successful restoration and enhancement of this old town.
- UNITED KINGDOM Chesterfield - for the extensive revitalisation of the city centre, including restoration, new development and creation of pedestrian areas.

D I P L O M A S

- AUSTRIA Weitra - for the attractive renovation of numerous buildings in the town centre.
- DENMARK Copenhagen - 'Yellow Warehouse' - for the superb restoration of a disused warehouse and its conversion into flats.
- FRANCE Le Puy - 'Centre Pierre Cardinal' - for the fine restoration of an old building for use as a cultural centre.
- GERMANY Bad Neuenahr-Ahrweiler - for the creation of an attractive pedestrian area and the renovation of surrounding buildings.
- Reutlingen - for the admirable conversion of a former boiler house to provide canteen and recreation facilities for a factory.
- Bietigheim-Bissingen - for the fine restoration of an interesting 16th century house.
- Wangen im Allgäu - for the admirable restoration of an old property for commercial use.
- Bellnhausen-Gladenbach - for the excellent restoration of a 17th century church which inspired similar work on numerous other buildings.
- Urach - for the superb restoration of a war-damaged 15th century house to be used for exhibitions and meetings.
- GREECE Cavalochori, Crete - for the beautiful restoration of a derelict dwelling-house.
- IRELAND Kilkenny - 'Shee Alms Houses' - for the fine restoration of a 16th century Alms House for use as a tourist administrative centre.
- ITALY South Tyrol - for the attractive restoration of ancient farm buildings in a mountain area.
- NETHERLANDS Klundert - for the successful restoration of sections of the fortress town severely damaged by war and flooding.
- Maastricht - for the harmonious development of an urban wasteland for residential use.

<u>SPAIN</u>	<u>Burgos Province - 'Santa Maria de Buggedo'</u> - for the beautiful restoration of a 13th century monastery. <u>Santillana del Mar</u> - for the fine restoration of the Palacio de la Infanta Dona Paz de Borbon for use as a cultural centre.
<u>SWEDEN</u>	<u>KARLSBORG FORTRESS</u> - for its restoration and adaptation for use as a military training centre. <u>Stockholm - 'Berwaldhallen'</u> - for the admirable and sensitively designed Concert Hall.
<u>SWITZERLAND</u>	<u>Yverdon</u> - for the fine renovation of part of the old town and creation of pedestrian areas.
<u>UNITED KINGDOM</u>	<u>Bath - 'Caxton Court'</u> - for the superb conversion of old brewery buildings into attractive dwellings. <u>Bristol - 'St Michaels Hill Terrace'</u> - for the excellent restoration of exteriors of old houses and internal conversion to meet modern requirements. <u>London - 'Silver Jubilee Walkway'</u> - for the admirable design of a marked sight-seeing tour for pedestrians. <u>York</u> - for the beautiful design of a harmonious new shopfront. <u>Ballachulish, Scotland</u> - for the successful reclamation of land disfigured by slate quarrying. <u>London - 'Wapping Sports Centre'</u> - for the excellent conversion of a disused workshop and the addition of a new hall to provide facilities for athletics.

Medals and Diplomas are awarded annually by Europa Nostra for projects which make an outstanding contribution to the conservation and enhancement of Europe's architectural and natural heritage.

The beautifully designed medals and diplomas are generously produced by Franklin Mint, which, together with its associate companies in different countries, is a leading producer of a variety of fine collectors' pieces.
