PART I -TERMS OF REFERENCE

CALL FOR TENDERS FOR THE PROVISION OF IT EQUIPMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CENTRAL MONITORING SYSTEM FOR THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE OF TÜRKIYE

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A. BACKGROUND

The Council of Europe (CoE) is currently implementing a project "Improving International Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters in Turkey", which aims to strengthen the capacities of Turkish authorities to establish effective and expedited international cooperation in criminal matters, thereby contributing to proper administration of justice in cases involving foreign elements. The Project is co-funded by the European Union and the CoE and implemented by the CoE.

In this context, the Ministry of Justice of Türkiye (MoJ/Beneficiary) and in particular the Directorate General for Foreign Relations and EU Affairs (DGFREU) will develop a Central Monitoring System (CMS), which will be an integral part of the existing Turkish National Judiciary Network (UYAP), in order to support the management of incoming and outgoing mutual legal assistance (MLA) requests.

The MoJ already uses an array of 12 high-end server computers in order to operate and maintain the UYAP system. The CMS software development project requires the MoJ to deploy additional hardware capabilities, as well as to improve the capacity of the existing servers, for the purposes of development and operation of the system. Furthermore, high-end laptop computers are needed for the development and maintenance of the software solution to be developed.

The Council of Europe is looking for one Provider (provided at least one tender meets the criteria indicated below) in order to support the implementation of the project with a particular expertise on delivering, installing and setting up IT equipment (server, servers upgrades, high-end laptops).

B. OBJECT AND SCOPE OF THE TENDERING PROCEDURE

Within the scope of the EU-CoE Joint Project, "Improving International Judicial Cooperation in Criminal Matters in Turkey", the Contractor shall achieve the following results:

Result-1: Required equipment is supplied, installed and configured.

Result-2: Warranty and licenses for the required equipment are provided.

The services required are described in detail in the Appendix I - **Technical Requirements,** attached to this Tender file.

The deadline for delivery and installation will be 60 days following the signature of the contract.

C. FEES

In accordance with Section F., tenderers are invited to submit a **quote** (**Pro Forma invoice**), on their letterhead, indicating their fees. These fees are final and not subject to review.

Such a quote shall include:

- the Service Provider's name and address;
- its VAT number;
- the full list of services:
- the fee per type of deliverables (in **Euros**, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in **Euros**, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in **Euros**), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

Should the Provider be willing to further break down its financial offer, it is invited to do so on a separate sheet, attached to the other supporting documents.

Tenders proposing fees above **the exclusion level (230,000€)** indicated in Appendix I will be **entirely and automatically** excluded from the tender procedure.

The payment for the Deliverables to be paid by the Council shall be made within 60 calendar days of submission of the invoice described in Article 10.3.1 of the Draft Contract (Appendix II), subject to the submission of the Deliverables and their acceptance by the Council.

D. HOW WILL THIS ONE-OFF CONTRACT WORK?

Once this consultation and the subsequent selection are completed, you will be informed accordingly. Deliverables will then be carried out in compliance with the description of deliverables as provided in Section B (above) and in the Appendix I - Technical Requirements. The Provider will be responsible for providing any deliverable before the deadline(s) fixed in Section B.

E. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria (by signing the Contract and the Declaration of Agreement, you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations) ¹

Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are an entity created to circumvent tax, social or other legal obligations (empty shell company), have ever created or are in the process of creation of such an entity;
- have been involved in mismanagement of the Council of Europe funds or public funds;
- are or appear to be in a situation of conflict of interest;
- are retired Council of Europe staff members or are staff members having benefitted from an early departure scheme;
- are or if their owner(s) or executive officer(s), in the case of legal persons, are included in the lists of persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at www.sanctionsmap.eu).

Eligibility criteria

Tenderers shall demonstrate that they fulfil the following criteria (to be assessed on the basis of all supporting documents listed in Section F):

- At least three years of experience in the provision of similar services
- Proper fulfilment of minimum two similar orders on delivering, installing, configuring IT systems during
 the last three years (the value of each order should not be less than EUR 50,000 (or equivalent in other
 currency))
- Minimum annual average turnover of EUR 80,000 (or equivalent in other currency) during the last three years (2020, 2021, 2022)
- License on the original equipment manufacturing and proposed solutions, or an authorisation that the tenderer is a dealer/partner/reseller of the proposed solution in Türkiye, including the authority to sell, upgrade, supply, service and maintain the proposed solution.

Award criteria

¹ The Council of Europe <u>reserves the right</u> to ask tenderers, at a later stage, to supply the following supporting documents:

An extract from the record of convictions or failing that an equivalent document issued by the competent judicial or administrative authority of the country
of incorporation, indicating that the first three and sixth above listed exclusion criteria are met;

⁻ A certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of incorporation indicating that the fourth criterion is met;

⁻ For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

For natural persons (including owners and executive officers of legal persons), a scanned copy of a valid photographic proof of identity (e.g. passport).

- Quality of the offer (60%), including:
 - Compliance with the Technical Requirements (Appendix I) and needs of the current order;
 - Ability to deploy, configure and provide support on the equipment according to the needs;
 - Capacity to meet the deadlines indicated in the Technical Specifications.
- Financial offer (40%).

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

F. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

- > A list of all owners and executive officers, for legal persons only (including those included in consortia);

All documents shall be submitted in English, with the exception of registration documents which may be in Turkish language; failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender. If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents <u>are of such a quality that</u> the documents cannot be read once printed.

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ARTICLE 1 – IDENTIFICATION OF THE CONTRACTING AUTHORITY

1.2 Background

The activities of the Organisation are governed by its Statute. These activities concern the promotion of human rights, democracy and the rule of law. The Organisation enjoys privileges and immunities provided for in the General Agreement on Privileges and Immunities of the Council of Europe, and its Protocols, and the Special Agreement relating to the Seat of the Council of Europe.³

ARTICLE 2 – VALIDITY OF THE TENDERS

Tenders are valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for their submission.

ARTICLE 3 – DURATION OF THE CONTRACT

The duration of the contract is set out in Article 2 of the Contract.

ARTICLE 4 – CHANGE, ALTERATION AND MODIFICATION OF THE TENDER FILE

Any change in the format, or any alteration or modification of the original tender will cause the immediate rejection of the tender concerned.

ARTICLE 5 – CONTENT OF THE TENDER FILE

The tender file is composed of:

ARTICLE 6 – LEGAL FORM OF TENDERERS

The tenderer must be a legal person or consortia of legal and/or natural persons.

The deadline for the submission of tenders is 26 June 2023 by 23:59 CET.

ARTICLE 10 – ASSESSMENT OF TENDERS

Tenders shall be assessed in accordance with Rule 1395 of 20 June 2019 on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe. Assessment shall be based upon the criteria as detailed in the Terms of Reference.

ARTICLE 11 – NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.
