COMMITTEE ON BIOETHICS (DH-BIO)

14th MEETING Strasbourg, 20-22 November 2018

ABRIDGED REPORT

I. Adoption of the agenda

1. The Committee on Bioethics (DH-BIO) held its 14th meeting in Strasbourg from 20 to 22 November 2018. The agenda of the meeting and the list of participants appear in Appendix I and Appendix II to this report.

II. Developments in the field of bioethics

- 2. The DH-BIO took note of the developments in the field of bioethics within the member states, as well as in international organisations. It also took note of the relevant developments in other Council of Europe bodies.
- III. Chart of signatures and ratifications of the Convention on Human Rights and Biomedicine, the Protocol on the Prohibition of Cloning Human Beings, the Protocol concerning Transplantation of Organs and Tissues of Human Origin, the Protocol concerning Biomedical Research and the Protocol concerning Genetic Testing for Health Purposes
- 3. The DH-BIO took note of the information sent in written form on the current process towards signature and/or ratification of the Convention on Human Rights and Biomedicine (Oviedo Convention) and/or its Additional Protocols in some member and observer states.

IV. Working methods and future activities of the DH-BIO

- 4. The DH-BIO held an exchange of views with Mr Christophe Poirel, Director for Human Rights, on the reflection process launched by the Secretary General on the role and impact of intergovernmental committees. Mr Poirel underlined the determining role of the Committee's work, emphasized the particular importance of its visibility in the current context and encouraged Delegations to maintain close contact with their respective Permanent Representations.
- 5. The Chair of the DH-BIO, Dr Beatrice Ioan (Romania), informed the DH-BIO on the first meeting between the Secretary General and the chairs of the intergovernmental committees which took place on 20 September 2018.

V. Public Debate

- 6. The Chair of the drafting group, Ms Tesi Aschan (Sweden), together with other members of the Drafting Group, recalled the reasons and objectives for the guide on public debate and summarized the progress made, which included a hearing with selected experts and practitioners that was held in Paris on 4 October 2018.
- 7. The DH-BIO heard presentations by two invited experts on practical examples of public debate processes which had taken place in Ireland and Poland, respectively.
- 8. The DH-BIO welcomed the preliminary draft guide prepared by the drafting group on public debate and supported its orientation. The Committee invited the drafting group to take note of the specific comments and proposals provided by delegations. Delegations were invited to provide their written comments on the current draft to the Secretariat at the latest by 10 December 2018.
- 9. The DH-BIO welcomed the general approach of the draft concept note and provisional draft programme for a high-level seminar on public debate, to be held in Strasbourg on

- 4 June 2019 under the auspices of the French Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers. It agreed to entrust the development of the programme of the seminar to the drafting group on public debate in cooperation with the Bureau, and with the assistance of the Secretariat.
- 10. Delegations were also invited to provide their comments and proposals to the current draft programme to the Secretariat at the latest <u>by 10 December 2018</u>.

VI. HELP course

- 11. Delegations were informed that the English version of the new HELP (Human Rights Education for Legal Professionals) course on key human rights principles in biomedicine, targeting both legal and medical professional, is now freely available on the HELP platform (http://help.elearning.ext.coe.int/). Other language versions were in preparation (Armenian, Italian, Romanian and Spanish). The Russian version of the course will be presented in Moscow on 29 November 2018 and launched in Minsk on 7 December 2018 within the framework of the Action Plan for Belarus.
- 12. The Secretariat invited Delegations to convey any expression of interests from national training institutes to cooperate with the Council of Europe to launch this course in their country.

VII. Cooperation with other committees

Ad Hoc Committee for the Rights of the Child (CAHENF)

- 13. The DH-BIO held an exchange of views with the Chair of the CAHENF, Ms Maria-Andriani Kostopoulou, with the aim of identifying areas of future co-operation between the two Committees, including in view of the current development, by the DH-BIO, of a Strategic Action Plan. Delegations raised a number of issues relating to children's rights in biomedicine.
- 14. The Chair of CAHENF thanked the DH-BIO for valuable expert contribution to the CAHENF's work on age assessment of migrant children and invited the DH-BIO to contribute, by June 2019, to the mid-term evaluation of the Strategy for the rights of the child 2016 2021.
- 15. In this context, the DH-BIO agreed to designate a rapporteur on children rights. Ms Ritva Halila (Finland) and Mr Miguel Oliveira Da Silva (Portugal) expressed their interest in this task.

European Committee on Organ Transplantation (CD-P-TO)

16. Ms Ritva Halila (Finland), representative of the DH-BIO to the CD-P-TO, informed the DH-BIO about the current work of that committee.

Consultative Committee of the Convention for the Protection of Individuals with regard to Automatic Processing of Personal Data (T-PD)

17. The DH-BIO was informed that the T-PD had presented the text of the draft Recommendation on Health-related data to the Steering Committee on Media and Information Society (CDMSI) with a view to its approval and presentation to the Committee of Ministers for adoption. The draft explanatory report was being finalised.

VIII. Strategic Action Plan

18. The Chair of the drafting group, Ms Siobhan O'Sullivan (Ireland), together with other members of the drafting group, presented an overview of the mission and strategic

objectives for the action plan. She highlighted the challenges posed by converging/emerging technologies for human dignity and liberty and addressed how established practices were being challenged (e.g. informed consent, migrants access to healthcare, autonomy of the child). She also questioned whether there was a need to examine and reinterpret existing bioethical principles and norms, including those referred to in the Oviedo Convention.

- 19. The DH-BIO welcomed the general approach of the preliminary draft Strategic Action Plan (SAP), comprising four pillars: "governance", "equity", "integrity" and "cooperation" and thematic areas under each of them. Within this framework, the Committee decided to entrust the drafting group on the SAP with the elaboration of a list of possible actions and to consult, where appropriate, other Council of Europe committees and other intergovernmental organisations.
- 20. The DH-BIO took note of the need to identify priorities for the next biennium (2020-2021) with a view to their presentation, in June 2019, to the Steering Committee on Human Rights (CDDH) for approval and then to the Committee of Ministers.
- 21. To these ends, delegations were invited to send to the Secretariat, at the latest by 21 December 2018, proposals for specific actions regarding the pillars, and, among these, to identify those actions proposed for the next biennium (2020-2021).
- IX. Additional Protocol on the protection of the human rights and dignity of persons with mental disorder with regard to involuntary placement and involuntary treatment
- 22. The DH-BIO took note of the opinions submitted by the European Committee for the Prevention of Torture (CPT), the Commissioner for Human Rights, the Parliamentary Assembly (PACE) Committees on Equality and Non-Discrimination and on Social Affairs, Health and Sustainable development and the Conference of INGOs. Delegations were informed that the Steering Committee for Human Rights (CDDH) and the European Committee on Crime Problems (CDPC) would submit their opinions after their respective plenary meetings, which would take place in the end of November.
- 23. The DH-BIO heard oral statements from the Chair of the Committee on Social Affairs, Health and Sustainable development, from the Representative of the Office of the Commissioner for Human Rights, from the Representative of the Conference of INGO's, from representatives of the European Disability Forum (EDF) and from the European Association of Service Providers for Persons with Disabilities (EASPD).
- 24. The DH-BIO held an exchange on the general objective and the general approach to be adopted in its further work, in the light of the comments received. With few exceptions, delegations agreed that the objective of the work remained relevant and should be further explained, when need be. In view of the opinions received and the oral statements given, delegations further agreed that the draft had to be carefully reviewed, having particular regard to strengthening the aspect of alternative and preventive measures. Particular attention had also to be given to further developing the collaboration with all relevant stakeholders.
- 25. In view of these considerations, the DH-BIO decided to invite the INGO's represented during the session to submit drafting proposals on alternative and preventive measures. The DH-BIO further decided to invite the European Psychiatrist Association (EPA) and other professional organisations, which had been represented during the first consultation hearing with INGO's in march 2014, to comment on specific aspects of the draft text. The

- DH-BIO entrusted the Bureau, with the assistance of the Secretariat, to draft a cover letter with relevant questions on the draft text.
- 26. Delegations were invited to submit their contributions together with their comments on the text of the Draft Additional Protocol, accompanied by drafting proposals, at the latest by 31 January 2019.
- 27. The Bureau would examine all comments and contributions received during its next meeting (March 2019) in view of making a proposal(s) on the modalities of the further work to the 15th DH-BIO (4 7 June 2019).
- 28. In accordance with the intent expressed earlier, the DH-BIO entrusted the Secretariat with exploring the possibilities for further action in the field of alternative and preventive measures, in particular in the form of a mapping exercise of best practices within member States. Cooperation with relevant INGO's and other actors in the field would be of particular importance for the achievement of the objective.

X. Cooperation activities

29. The DH-BIO was informed about activities carried out as part of the Action Plan in Belarus.

XI. <u>Bureau Elections</u>

- 30. The term of Dr Beatrice loan coming to an end, the DH-BIO elected by acclamation Ms Tesi Aschan (Sweden) as its new Chair for a one year term, renewable once.
- 31. As the two candidates to the vice-chairmanship obtained the same number of votes, the DH-BIO decided to proceed again to the election of the Vice-Chair at its next plenary meeting (4-7 June 2019).
- 32. The DH-BIO re-elected by acclamation Ms Ritva Halila (Finland) and Prof. Miguel Oliveira da Silva (Portugal), for new terms of two years as members of the Bureau. Following the end of term of Dr Givi Javashvili (Georgia) and Ms Maria Concepcion Martin Arribas (Spain), the DH-BIO elected by acclamation Ms Rodica Gramma (Moldova), Prof. Pierre Mallia (Malta), and Ms Sarah Rueda (France) as new members of the Bureau for a term of office of two years, renewable once.

XII. Dates of next meetings

- 33. The DH-BIO agreed on the following dates for its next meetings to be held in Strasbourg:
 - 15th meeting of the DH-BIO: 4 7 June 2019
 - 16th meeting of the DH-BIO: 19-21 November 2019

XIII. Decisions taken by the DH-BIO at its 14th meeting

34. The DH-BIO agreed exceptionally to proceed by written procedure for the adoption of the decisions. In the absence of objections to the draft sent by the Secretariat, the decisions are adopted on 30 November 2018.

XIV. Other business

35. Delegations were reminded of the importance of assuring the quorum necessary for taking decisions (31 delegations) until the end of each plenary session.

- 36. The gender equality Rapporteur, Mr Constantinos Phellas (Cyprus), expressed his intention to prepare a draft action plan in order to mainstream gender equality into areas and activities of the DH-BIO. The Chair took note of the rapporteur's intention and **invited** delegations to send him their comments and suggestions by email.
- 37. The DH-BIO agreed to entrust the Secretariat with the task of preparing a questionnaire to assess the impact, at national level, of Rec(2016)8 on processing of health related data for insurance purposes, including data resulting from genetic tests with a view to be presented to the Bureau for approval before it is send to delegations.
