Participants are invited to discuss the <u>status of signature</u>, <u>ratification</u> or accession by specific countries.

3. Information provided by parties and observers – Tour de table

Participants are invited to present information on legislative developments, major cases, important events, training provided to other countries, including by international organisations etc.

4. Dialogue with international organisations (T-CY observers)

Representatives of international organisations with observer status in the T-CY are invited to present relevant activities and engage in a dialogue with T-CY members. Observers include the African Union Commission, ENISA, European Union, Interpol, ITU, OAS, OECD, OSCE, UNODC, G8 High-tech Crime Subgroup.

5. Follow up to T-CY Assessment Report on the expedited preservation provisions

The T-CY – at its 8th Plenary in December 2012 – adopted the <u>Assessment Report</u> which states that "The T-CY will review progress made within 18 months of adoption of the report (that is, by mid-2014)."

Parties are invited to provide a brief update on follow up measures taken. They are furthermore invited to discuss the implications of the <u>judgment of the European Court of Justice</u> declaring Data Retention Directive 2006/24/EC invalid.

6. Assessment of Articles 31 and related Articles on international cooperation: Finalisation of the draft report and draft recommendations*

Parties and observers are invited to provide comments on the draft assessment report in view of its finalisation.

Parties are invited to discuss the draft recommendations in view of their adoption.

It is strongly recommended that delegations comprise practitioners responsible for mutual assistance in the Parties.

7. Provisions to be assessed in the 3rd round of T-CY assessments (2015)*

Parties will be invited to consider which provisions are to be analysed in the 3rd round of assessments (in 2015). The Bureau proposes to assess Article 13 (Sanctions and Measures). A comparative analysis would give guidance to States reforming their legislation.

Following a T-CY decision on the items to be assessed, the Bureau would then prepare a draft questionnaire for consideration and adoption at the 12th Plenary (December 2014).

Transborder access to data*

Parties are invited to make proposals for additional Guidance Notes.

Parties are invited to consider progress made.

In line with Article 6 of the <u>Rules of Procedures</u>, the T-CY is invited to elect the chair, vice-chair and members of the Bureau of the T-CY.

12. Financial resourcing of the T-CY for 2014-15*

The Secretariat will inform participants on the state of financial resources available for the T-CY in 2014-15.

Following the decision on T-CY financing taken at the 9th Plenary, Parties are invited to consider financial support to the T-CY through voluntary contribution to the <u>CYBERCRIME@OCTOPUS</u> project.
