Planned activity(ies): During the Data Protection Week the following activities and events took place:

1. Cooperation Agreement with the Ministry of Science and Education

The signing of this agreement contributes to the right path to the protection of personal data and privacy of the Albanian students and pupils. This mutual agreement will pave the way for a general awareness raising campaign among all pupils and students, as a continuous process undertaken by the Commissioner's office.

2. Awareness Raising activity with the students of journalism at the University of Tirana

Office of the Commissioner for Personal Data Protection organized an activity with second-year students of journalism at the University of Tirana. During this activity, students were introduced to the Law on Personal Data Protection, the Office of the Commissioner for the Protection of Personal Data and its mission as well as legal acts passed by the Commissioner, such as Guidelines for "Processing of Personal Data in the field of Education" and Guidelines for "Printed and Audiovisual Media".

3. European Day of Personal Data Protection with pupils of "Dora d'Istria" school

Representatives of the 9th grade's pupils and young journalists of the school's newspaper were introduced with the Supervisory Authority, the Office of the Commissioner for Personal Data Protection and concepts of privacy. Presentation of

the latest news in the field of privacy on the Internet, geographic localization, giving and receiving consent, privacy and marketing etc, were introduced to these pupils. Pupils of the school "Dora d'Istria" were introduced to new risks of casual use of "social networks" in relation to creating fake profiles or/and risks that can come from inappropriate creation of a network of friends in the wider virtual environment of the Internet.

4. Participation in the Conference: "28 January 2011 Data Protection Day: The 30-anniversary of the Council of Europe Convention for the Protection of Personal Data."

On January 28, 2011, on the European Data Protection Day, in Budapest, Hungary, the Conference: "30th Anniversary of Convention 108 of the Council of Europe" took place. To celebrate this day as a respected European authority, as well as to exchange experience between colleagues regarding the implementation of the Convention and in connection with the implementation of the Albanian Law on the Protection of Personal Data in the last two years, Mrs. Flora Çabej (Pogaçe), Commissioner for Personal Data Protection participated in this important activity. Mrs. Çabej held a power-point presentation which briefly introduced the progress of implementation of the law on personal data protection in Albania, competencies and their application by the Albanian supervisory authority, and dealt especially with the awareness-raising measures undertaken by the Albanian authority about the risk of "social networks" on the Internet.

Aim(s):

1. Such an agreement guarantees special protection of personal data for Albanian pupils and students throughout their school life, from primary school to postgraduate studies, guaranteeing and protecting their right to privacy. Inclusion to this commitment of parents will be a priority of the Office of the Commissioner.

2. The future Journalists of Albania were the targeted group of this event, tackling the issues of the balance between the right to information and the right to privacy.

3. Students became familiar with the advices package approved by the Office of the Commissioner for Personal Data Protection in relation to the protection of privacy on social networks and were presented with efficient ways of eliminating fake profiles on these social networks. During the meeting, awareness leaflets were distributed, which

will be published later in the school newspaper to further convey the message of awareness on the topics of privacy protection to students.

4. This conference focused on three main issues: 1. The history of the 108 Convention of year 1981 “For the Protection of Individuals with regard to Automatic Processing of Personal Data”; 2. Legal Issues; 3. The Convention in the eyes of new members who have ratified it. Results of this conference are considered very important by the Office of the Commissioner, because firstly, the participation and contribution of our Office in these international meetings has already created the possibility for European counterparts to get familiar and acquainted with the progress of our authority. On the other hand, this conference, as well as several different activities during year 2010, created opportunities for our office to be introduced with common concerns created by the advancement of technology, but also recognition of other experienced authorities' approach to solutions and practices followed by them, in a case by case basis.

On 28 January 2011, the European Commission, the Council of Europe and its Member States have celebrated Data Protection Day for the fifth time.

Mr Thorbjørn Jagland, Secretary General of the Council of Europe, and Ms Viviane Reding, Vice-President of the European Commission, decided to seize this opportunity to organise a high-level joint event to allow both institutions to join forces and to promote the fundamental right to data protection.

The event organised in Brussels marked the 30th anniversary of the Council of Europe Convention for the protection of individuals with regard to automatic processing of personal data, known as “Convention 108”, which was opened for signature on 28 January 1981. The event also marked the beginning of a public consultation organised in the context of the modernisation of Convention 108.

It gathered over 300 participants (from 32 countries) representing diplomatic missions to the EU, data protection authorities, industry, NGOs, academics, government officials, representatives of international organisations and privacy lawyers.

This event was a success both in terms of level of participation and visibility, as Convention 108 was referred to on several occasions as a unique international instrument and its potential to be applied worldwide was underlined.

“Confronted with the challenges raised by the rapid development of information technology, privacy rights matter more than ever. The Data Protection Convention has been a key tool for ensuring this right for 30 years and must be adapted to ensure this for the next 30 years as well,” Secretary General Thorbjørn Jagland said, emphasising *“the need for a truly international framework that is human rights based, flexible, transparent and inclusive.”*
