Current legislation issues

- Renewed Local Government act has been accepted by the Parliament – coming into force May 2015
- Aiming to opening up municipal administration and decision making better, special note to e-networking
- Some changes for better flexibility of e-meetings and informing the citizens
 - Rules, publicity
 - e-decision prosess defined
 - Some former voluntary bodies now defined as obligatory
- Open data and internet availablity of documents underlined, specially in economic issues
- Experiment of electronic local referendum in preparation
 - Not binding, but consultative

Current, practical challenges

- Network security is a key issue perhaps too much so is security to vote more important than right to vote?
- ICT development work is too limited, must be more user orientated, specially in municipalities must ICT development be done more in co-operation with employees and their expertise
- Geographical data and user querys shows some good practises – special reports for municipal amalgamation cases (City of Oulu area)
- Applications tend to be too complicated, to simplify is to serve citizens better
- Financial savings potential should be made from potential to reality – more partnership is needed

Workshop observations and some best practises to share

- State-municipal realationship workshop arranged with the help of Council of Europe center of expertise, november 2013 in Helsinki aimed to help preparation of the new Local Government Act
 - The Nordic Countries, Estonia, the Netherlands and UK took part
 - Good discussion of common challenges: defining financial framework, statistical development, use of ICT to serve citizens better
 - Lessons to Finland: further development of local government statistic administration, defined by new Local Government Act
 - Estonia continued good work to further develop customer-oriented data on Ministry web site
 - Further co-operation of countries needed in State-municipality relationship development
- Some lessons from Oulu area (municipal amalgamation special report)
 - Municipal ICT development work cannot be done in isolation, but in co-operation of other municipalities and with
 the expertise of sector personnell from municipality (specially social and health care, education) concrete
 results are possible with sector knowledge combined to ICT expertise yet the huge savings potential of the ICT
 should be made into reality rather than just the empty promise & vain hope co-operation, opening up and
 finding the partnership are key issues to turn savings potential into reality from theory
 - Applications should be more simple to quarantee the critical mass of end users, simple solutions tend to be the most genious ones
 - Specially mapping exercises (defining for example municipal service locations and development potential) for citizens proved to be popular and practical in visualisation the problems
- Financial savings potential should be made from potential to reality more partnership is needed
 - In Oulu case, one best practise was the common treatment of municipal democracy, municipal ecomomy and municipal employer/employees issues
 - Better view of the whole picture: possibility to obtain better balance of economy, better quality of democracy and the common programme to develope municipal human resources – in situation where it is higher need for financial squeece and yet growing capacity of social & health sectors
 - Work will continue with the New Government after the April 2015 elections
