

Mr Davor Derenčinović is a Croatian national. He holds a PhD in criminal law sciences (University of Zagreb Faculty of Law) and has completed post-doctoral research (Fulbright program) in International Terrorism, Organised Crime and Human Rights at the International Human Rights Law Institute of DePaul University (Chicago, United States of America).

Mr Derenčinović is currently Professor of Criminal Law and Head of Department for Criminal Law. He has lectured and carried out research at a number of academic and scientific institutions, such as the London School of Economics, the Max-Planck Institute in Freiburg and the International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences in Siracuza, Italy. He is the author of 30 books (including chapters) and more than 70 articles in legal periodicals.

Mr Derenčinović is also President of the Croatian Academy of Legal Sciences, President of the Society of University Teachers and other Scientists of the University of Zagreb, and member of the State Attorney's Council. He has participated in a number of working groups drafting new criminal legislation or legislative amendments in Croatia. Further, he has worked as a consultant for the United Nations Office for Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).
