MAIN ISSUES BEFORE THE COMMITTEE OF MINISTERS - ONGOING SUPERVISION*

> Actions of security forces – Effective investigations

Ineffective investigations into suspicious deaths of individuals during the conflict in Northern Ireland either during security forces operations or in circumstances giving rise to suspicion of collusion with those forces.

Various shortcomings in the investigation proceedings, notably lack of independence of investigative police officers, lack of public scrutiny and information to victim's families on reasons for decisions not to prosecute; defects in the police investigations, absence of legal aid for the victims' families, delays in inquest proceedings.

> Private life - Retention of information

Retention for an indefinite period of cellular samples, fingerprints and DNA profiles, in connection with arrests for offences for which the persons concerned were ultimately not convicted.

> Freedom of expression

Excessive amount of "success fees" imposed on a publishing company and payable to the opposing party's lawyers - with a chilling effect on its right to freedom of expression for having breached confidence in publishing private information.

SUPERVISION CLOSED - MAIN REFORMS ADOPTED**

> **Actions of security forces – Effective investigations**

Creation of a special unit (Iraq Historic Allegations Team) together with the special inquests (Iraq Fatality Investigations) in order to ensure effective and independent investigations of allegations of unlawful killings and possible abuse of Iraqi civilians by UK armed forces in Iraq between 2003 and 2009.

In addition, designation of a judge of the High Court to oversee the progress of the investigative process and to hear all public and private law claims arising from UK military operations in Iraq.

> **Protection against ill-treatment**

Protection of children against parental violence was enhanced through amendments of the relevant legislations together with awareness raising measures to clarify the law for non-lawyers, parents and childcare professionals.

Change of the House of Lords jurisprudence so that local authorities and social services can be held liable for failing to act to prevent child abuse.

> **Protection against forced labour and servitude**

New legislation of 2009 criminalising holding a person in slavery or servitude or requiring a person to perform forced or compulsory labour.

> **Lawfulness of the detention – Psychiatric hospitals**

Introduction of procedural safeguards for the placement and detention of legally incapacitated, compliant persons in psychiatric institutions. Independent Advocacy bodies are commissioned to provide support, assistance and, in some cases, representation of the legally incapacitated or his/her relatives throughout the procedure of detention.

> **Detention and other rights**

Change of domestic case-law defining more clearly the scope and grounds of the Secretary of State's power to release whole life order prisoners in accordance with Article 3 of the Convention.

SUPERVISION CLOSED - MAIN REFORMS ADOPTED**

Some categories of detainees now have the right to vote: those on temporary licence and those on home detention curfew. Additional measures were taken to ensure that detainees are duly informed of their disenfranchisement at the point of sentence (England, Wales and Northern Ireland) or in the areas where they are first received into prisons (Scotland).

> Issues related to foreigners - Expulsion

Adoption of measures ensuring the deportation of aliens in detention with sufficient diligence: comprehensive instructions and guidance for immigration staff to avoid excessive length of detention pending deportation.

> Protection of private and family life

Revision of statutory guidance to safeguard children's welfare, providing advice on the process to follow if a person has concerns about the welfare of a child and in particular concerns that a child may be suffering, or is at risk of suffering harm. When a court makes an Emergency Protection Order (EPO), it may give additional directions as to the contact the child may have with certain persons and may be allowed to have with others.

Introduction of the requirement of a systematic justification for the use of CCTV surveillance cameras; limitations on the retention and disclosure of images to third parties (mostly medias) and clear restrictions on the monitoring and recording of conversations in public spaces.

Introduction of new circumscribed powers which only allow the police to stop and search people and vehicles without suspicion in exceptional circumstances, where a senior police officer reasonably suspects that an act of terrorism will take place and where the measure is necessary to prevent such acts.

> Protection against gender-based discrimination

Removal of the ban on homosexuals serving in the military, following the introduction of the Armed Forces Code of Social Conduct Policy Statement in 2000.

Same sex relationships considered as equal to relationships between persons of opposite sex when examining financial obligations regarding child support.

Legal recognition of transsexual people who have taken decisive steps to live fully and permanently in their acquired gender. Their applications are assessed by the Gender Recognition Panel; if successful, a Gender Recognition certificate is delivered granting the recognition for all purpose, including the right to marry a person of the opposite gender, social security benefits and the receipt of a state pension.

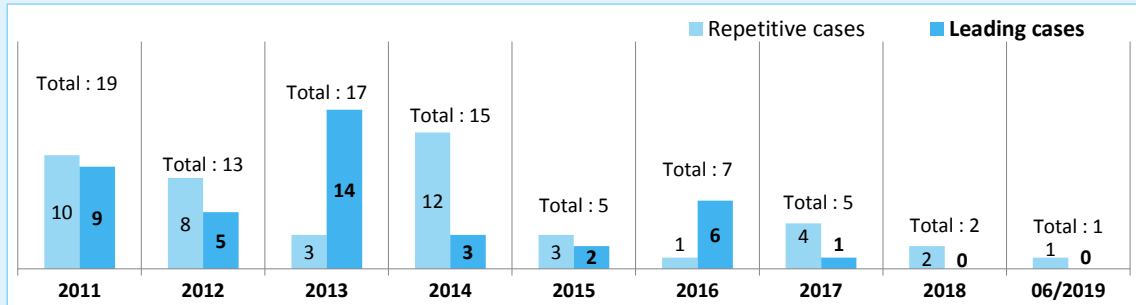

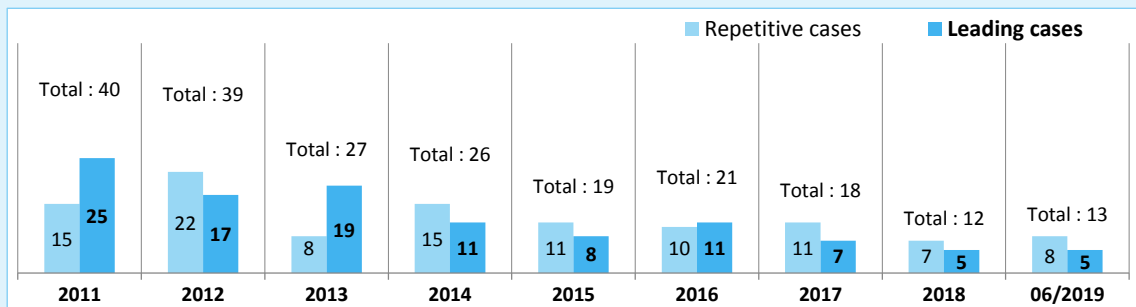

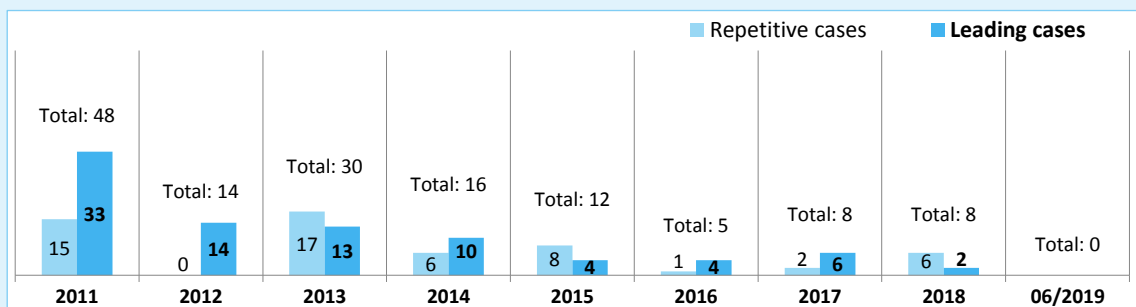

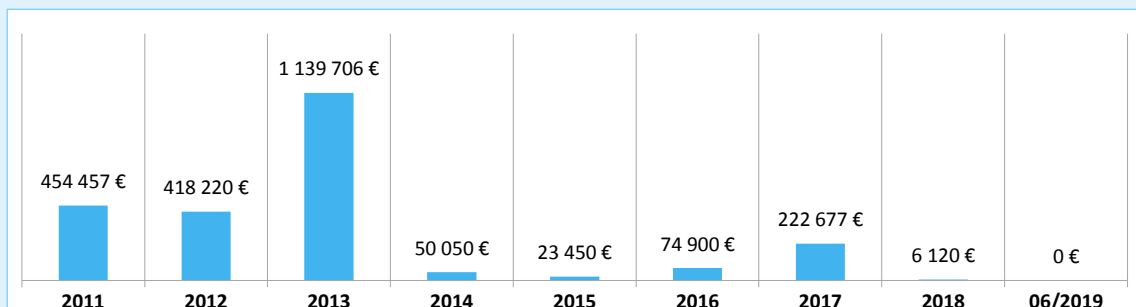
Pending cases
