Strasbourg, 17-18 June 2014

Abridged meeting report

1 Introduction

The T-CY Committee, meeting in Strasbourg on 17 and 18 June 2014, was chaired by Markko Künnapu (Estonia). Some 80 representatives of State Parties and Observers participated;

It was followed by a Conference on Article 15 Safeguards and Law Enforcement Access to Data (19-20 June 2014).

2 Decisions

The T-CY decided:

Agenda item 2: Status of signatures, ratifications, accessions to the Budapest Convention and its Protocol

- To note with appreciation the accession by Panama to the Convention on Cybercrime;
- To take note of steps underway in view of ratification or accession to the Convention or its Protocol in Andorra, Argentina, Czech Republic, Israel, Luxembourg, Philippines, Mexico, Monaco, Morocco, Senegal and Turkey and that ratification of or accession to the Convention can be expected by several of these States in the course of 2014;
- To encourage States that have signed or been invited to accede to become Parties as soon as possible.

Agenda item 3: Information provided by parties and observers – Tour de table

- To note with interest information provided on cybercrime policies, legislative developments, training or major cases by Albania, Armenia, Australia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Dominican Republic, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Iceland, Japan, Lithuania, Mauritius, Mexico, Moldova, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, Panama, Philippines, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Sri Lanka, Singapore, Slovakia, "The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia", Tonga, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, and USA;
- To draw attention to a trend that carries risks to the rule of law: while the threat and complexity of cybercrime and challenges related to electronic evidence are increasing, the authority of criminal justice institutions to investigate and prosecute cybercrime and to obtain and share electronic evidence appears to be diminishing.

Agenda item 4: Dialogue with international organisations (T-CY observers)

To welcome the information shared by the European Commission and Europol.

Agenda item 5: Follow up to T-CY Assessment Report on the expedited preservation provisions

- To assess the implementation of the expedited preservation provisions by Denmark, Iceland and the new Parties to the Convention at the 12th Plenary; to invite these Parties to complete the questionnaire and submit it to the Secretariat by 31 August 2014 in view of the preparation of a draft supplementary report for consideration by the 12th Plenary;
- To invite Parties to submit information in writing to the Secretariat by 31 August 2014 on follow up given to the Assessment Report adopted in December 2012 (T-CY(2012)10rev) where domestic provisions were considered "partially" or "not in line" with the Budapest

Convention – and other Parties to submit additional information as appropriate – in view of the preparation of a draft report for consideration by the 12th Plenary;

- To call on Parties to make more extensive use of the expedited preservation provisions (Articles 16, 17, 29 and 30);
- To take note of the preliminary ruling of the European Court of Justice in April 2014 declaring
 Data Retention Directive 2006/24/EC invalid which while not putting in question the principle of data retention confirms rule of law requirements to be met;
- To note that while this ruling does not annul domestic laws implementing this Directive, the implications of this ruling on domestic legislation are now being studied by many State Parties and Observers.

Agenda item 6: Assessment of Article 31 and related Articles on international cooperation: Finalisation of the draft report and draft recommendations

- To continue to give consideration to the draft assessment report at the 12th Plenary in view of its adoption;
- To invite Parties and Observers to provide further information and comments on the draft report by 15 September 2014.

Agenda item 7: Provisions to be assessed in the 3rd round of T-CY assessments (2015)

- To dedicate the 3rd cycle of assessments on Article 13 (sanctions and measures) and request the Bureau to prepare a draft questionnaire for consideration at the 12th plenary;
- To underline the importance of the question of jurisdiction, and thus to maintain Article 22 as a possible provision to be assessed in the following round of assessments.

Agenda item 8: Transborder access to data

To take note of the constructive exchange of views held between the T-CY transborder group,
 EU Data Protection Working Party 29, European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS) and
 Consultative Committee of the Convention for the Protection of Individuals with regard to

With regard to the Draft Guidance Note on Subscriber Information:

- To consider that the adoption of a Guidance Note on Subscriber Information reflecting the common understanding of the Parties would be premature given the diverse rules, conditions and procedures in the Parties;
- To request the Secretariat to turn the summary of the replies to the questionnaire into a stand-alone report;
- To encourage Parties to take account of the observations of this report when reforming their domestic legislation.

With regard to additional Guidance Notes:

To invite the Bureau to continue its work on a Guidance Note on SPAM.

6. Assessment of Articles 31 and related Articles on international cooperation: Finalisation of the draft report and draft recommendations*

Parties and observers are invited to provide comments on the draft assessment report in view of its finalisation.

Parties are invited to discuss the draft recommendations in view of their adoption.

It is strongly recommended that delegations comprise practitioners responsible for mutual assistance in the Parties.

7. Provisions to be assessed in the 3rd round of T-CY assessments (2015)*

Parties will be invited to consider which provisions are to be analysed in the 3rd round of assessments (in 2015). The Bureau proposes to assess Article 13 (Sanctions and Measures). A comparative analysis would give guidance to States reforming their legislation.

Following a T-CY decision on the items to be assessed, the Bureau would then prepare a draft questionnaire for consideration and adoption at the 12th Plenary (December 2014).
