Eurimages Co-production Development Award

STRASBOURG, 19.07.2011 – The Council of Europe's Eurimages Fund is joining forces with the Sarajevo Film Festival's co-production market (CineLink) to award the *Eurimages Co-production Development Award* at its forthcoming event on 27-30 July 2011.

The award, a cash prize of 30 000 euros, has been created to encourage European co-production from the initial stages of a project.

To be eligible, projects must participate in the CineLink and be designed from the outset as a European co-production intended for cinema release between at least two member states of the Eurimages Fund for reasons other than purely financial.

The Eurimages Co-Production Development Award will be awarded on the basis of the project's artistic quality and its prospects of remaining a European co-production. The award, which takes the form of a non-reimbursable subsidy, will be used by the beneficiary exclusively for the purposes of meeting the development expenses of the project.

The first Eurimages Co-Production Development Award was given to the project *Wolf* by Bogdan Mustata (produced by Strada Film, Bucharest) as part of the CineLink event held during the Sarajevo Film Festival in July 2010 while the second Eurimages Co-Production Development Award went to a project called *Chaika* by Miguel Angel Jiménez (produced by Kinoskopik, Alava, Spain) at the New Cinema Network in Rome in November 2010 and the third one to the project *Kid* by Fien Troch (produced by Prime Time in Brussels) at the last CineMart which took place during the International Film Festival in Rotterdam.
