Congress adopts guidelines on preventing radicalisation and manifestations of hate at the grassroots level

Strasbourg, 20.10.2015 – Prevention and the reintegration of radicalised individuals are the two main focuses of the “Guidelines on preventing radicalisation and manifestations of hate at the grassroots level” adopted by the Congress 29th session in Strasbourg, France, on 20 October 2015. The resolution presented by rapporteur Leen Verbeek (Netherlands, SOC) stresses that, to ensure respect for human rights, it is essential to approach the issue of safety and security of citizens in a balanced manner, weighing the necessity and proportionality of each action.

“In the face of radicalisation a ~~alone is not the solution~~ to combat these phenomena, it is essential to take preventive action. This is the area of action *par excellence* of local authorities”, stressed the rap

Countering radicalisation also means implementing an information strategy, with particular emphasis on a cohesive discourse, training for those working in the front line and education, within the family and at school, based on respect for cultural diversity and human rights. The text adopted calls in particular on European cities and regions to design multi-agency strategies involving local stakeholders. Local and regional authorities should also involve civil society and support de-radicalisation programmes by allocating the necessary funds to relevant NGOs. This should become an ordinary budget item with stable long-term financing.

In this connection, the Congress has launched a European cities and regions against violent extremism initiative. The first event under this initiative, which is being conducted jointly with the European Forum for Urban Security (EFUS), will be a conference of local authorities on the prevention of radicalisation leading to violent extremism, hosted by the Mayors of Aarhus and Rotterdam, which will take place in Aarhus, Denmark, on 18 November 2015.
