Speakers Biography

• Group session: "Eyes on the stars"

Anja Dihrberg (Anja Dihrberg Casting), Germany

Anja Dihrberg began her career working in theatre in Vienna and at the Berliner Schiller Theatre, until moving into film/TV production in 1995. She started her own casting company in 1997, working with German directors including Oskar Roehler, Baran Bo Odar, and Emily Atef as well as on international projects. She won the Casting Prize (Cologne Conference 2000) and is based in Cologne and Berlin.

Beatrice Kruger (FBI Casting), Italy

Rome-based Beatrice Kruger is a European Casting Director and a member of CSA and UICD. She is the founder of www.e-talenta.eu, which is an international platform for casting professionals and European actors, which is accessible in English, Italian, German, French, Spanish and Russian languages.

Annette Trumel (Archikast), France

Annette Trumel casts French films and European co-productions. Once a journalist, she came to cinema industry when hired as a 3rd Assistant Director to James Ivory. Through him, she became a Casting Director on A Soldier's Daughter Never Cries. She has worked with directors such as Bruno Dumont, Marc Recha, Agnieszka Holland and Andrzej Zulawski.

Marco Villotta, Italy

Since 2003 I have been working for Centro Espressioni Cinematografiche, a cultural association in Udine, Italy, which manages two cinemas in town, the Visionario and the Centrale, for a total of five screens. The Far East Film Festival, dedicated to Asian popular cinema, is the most important cultural and artistic project handled by C.E.C. and has reached its 18th edition this year. In 2008 we also started a distribution company together with another Europa Cinemas member of our region, Cinemazero. We have distributed both Asian and European films, among these Departures by Takita Yōjirō, The High Sun by Dalibor Matanić and Zoran, my nephew the idiot by Matteo Oleotto.

Charlene Lydon, Ireland

Charlene joined Element Pictures in 2010 as part of the script development team after completing a Masters in Film Theory and History and spending time working as a film journalist. In 2011 she joined Volta, Element's VOD platform as Programming and Editorial Manager. She is also the Programmer for Light House Cinema since it re-opened in January 2012.
