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

Vjosa IRBMP

The drafting of the IRBMP is at the early stage

AMBU is in charge for drafting it with the Support of the EU 4 Rivers Programme

Currently is concluded the Methodology to be selected and the project is working on mapping of key issues and stakeholders

Vjosa IRBMP must be aligned with the MP of the Vjosa WRNP Both driving agencies NAPA and AMBU are showing good will to align

The IRBMP is expected to be adopted no earlier than $2027\,$

New Law on Protected Areas

Process of Amendment for the Law on PAs

- 20th November 2023: 12 MPs have initiated the Law Amendments
- NGOs have drafted the opposition on the amendments
- MoTE has not shared their draft

- 7th -10th January 2024: Online

"Consultations" were organized with NGOs

- 15th -30th January NGOs have sent Objections to oppose the amendments



 October 2023: Municipalities sent a request for law amendments to the Parliamentary Commission

- December 2023: The Draft Amendments were accessible to the public for consultation
- NGOs have reacted publicly to oppose the process and the draft

- 22nd February 2024: The new Law is approved
- 22nd February 2024: NGOs have organized Protest in front of the Parliament
- 18th March Law was confirmed by Presidential Decree
- Opposition Party have showed support to address the case to the Constitutional Court

Weaknesses of the Law on PAs

Weak public consultation process

The version of the law discussed with interested parties was completely different from the one approved.

The new law establishes principles that contradict the essence of the previous law on protected areas, as well as the EU Directives.

The new law transfers the managing competences from NAPA to NCT, significantly centralizing the process and reducing transparency.

The law opens all PAs and their core areas to tourism infrastructures which counters its primary objective "to ensure special protection of environmentally protected areas and important components of biodiversity"

Shushica River

The Project

The Intake at the headwaters of Shushica River

17.35 km pipeline with the 500 mm diameter

8.5 km new access roads

5 storage locations

2 small HPPs along the pipelines

This project is developed by CES Salzgitter GmbH Consultant

It is financed jointly by Albanian Government and KfW and WBIF

The ADF is responsible for the project Implementation.

The construction company is a joint venture between Austrian J.V STRABAG AG and TREMA Engineering $2\,\cdot$

Total Investment of the water supply is estimated around 9.5 Mio EUR while the entire programme that includes the construction of the sewage water treatment is about 45 Mio \leqslant





The History

The planning phase

In late $2019 \rightarrow$ Preparation of the feasibility study Between May 2020 - May $2021 \rightarrow$ Preparation of EIA and Consultation process On May 5^{th} , $2021 \rightarrow$ NEA issued the Environmental Permit based on the Preliminary EIA. December $2021 \rightarrow$ RBC Vjose, Water Use Permit and Late March $2022 \rightarrow$ Himara Municipality issued the Construction Permit

The Construction phase

In early $2023 \rightarrow$ The construction has started on Himara side

Up to now \rightarrow The construction has taken place only on setting up the pipeline







Integral part of the Vjosa & to be included to Vjosa WRNP



Conclusions & Claims

- Quick Set up of Managing Authority for the Vjosa WRNP
- > The draft and adoption of the Vjosa IRBMP must be aligned with the WRNP MP
- As the new law on PAs is not aligned with the principles of Nature Conservation additional attention and monitoring of its implementation should be ensured
- > Re: An on-the-spot-appraisal from Bern Convention or a strong recommendation based on IUCN study outcomes
- Suspension of the Shushica Diversion project and consider other alternatives
- > RE: Cancellation of the VIA project at current stage and restoration of the habitat
- > All future development plans must get consulted with stakeholders within Albania as well as with the Convention as they may result in an irreversible damage of the biodiversity of the area
