There is at present a huge gap between those with an opioid dependence syndrome and the availability and access to treatment as highlighted by the CND at its intersessional meetings at the close of the year. In the outcome document of the 2016 UNGASS on the world drug problem, UN Member States reiterated a "commitment to improving access to controlled substances for medical and scientific purposes by appropriately addressing existing barriers in this regard......". This session provides for a discussion on the way this may be achieved in the coming years for the benefit of those that do not need to be subjected to such barriers that in turn may impact on the well-being of all.
