## ANAMUR SEA TURTLE NESTING SITE

- 12.7km sea turtle nesting beach
- 2<sup>nd</sup> most important sea turtle nesting site in Turkey &
   4<sup>th</sup> in the Mediterranean<sub>1</sub>
  - Nests/yr Average = **733**<sub>2</sub>
  - Recent years have recorded 1,000+ nests
- The natural habitat of the creek is an important area for the Critically Endangered Mediterranean subpopulation of the Soft Shell Nile Turtles (Trionyx triunguis)
  - Entire Mediterranean subpopulation estimated to be less than 1000 adult individuals

#### LEGISLATIVE PROTECTION OF ANAMUR

- Recommendation No.66 (1998) on the conservation status of some nesting beaches for marine turtles in Turkey on 4<sup>th</sup> December 1998.
  - <u>Measure No.1</u> Necessitates **Environmental Impact Assessments** (EIAs) to be carried out for projects.
  - Measure No.4 Assure inter-ministerial compliance for marine turtle conservation
  - Measure No.5 Urgent & stringent measures to enforce legislation against illegal sand extraction.
  - <u>Species Protection</u> Anamur Beach: To Prohibit sand extraction & Secure remaining unbuilt beach plots against development.
- Turkish Ministry of Environment & Forestry Circular No:B.18.0.DMP.0.01.03/831.02 Oct 2009
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Conservation Areas. (The Protection Zone)
  - (b) Prohibits alteration of the land (digging/filling)
  - (c) No alterations to the sand (removal or additions)
  - (f) The use of lights at night will be prevented and audited by taking necessary measures
  - (g) Requirement of Ministerial permission from Environment & Forestry Ministry for projects

# KARAAĞAÇ NESTING BEACH







Site has not been fully restored to its natural state.

# Dragon Çayi Rivulet





Removal of the illegal shanties, sheds and huts, deprived of a sewage system are being removed.

However, new plans of development for the area have not been made public

<u>In Conclusion-</u> There is a complete lack of transparency and communication of current and proposed development plans

# We encourage the Turkish Government to:

- Ensure Karaağac and Sarisu Creek is fully restored to its previous natural state
- To provide transparency, collaborate and communicate with the local NGOs
- Ensure local businesses and authorities comply with Turkish National Law (Circular # B.18.0.DMP.0.01.03) and the Bern Convention Recommendation No. 66 (1998)

## Call upon the Standing Committee of the Bern Convention to:

- Encourage the authorities to implement all the necessary actions listed above
- Conduct an on-the-spot appraisal during summer 2022
- Ensure all relevant stakeholders are engaged in the Marine Turtle Initiative
