









Fig. 1. Conceptual framework of the main pathways for the wider effects of the COVID-19 pandemic

Shown is the rolling 7-day average. The number of confirmed cases is lower than the number of actual cases; the main reason for that is limited testing.







Figure 5.1: Time horizons of key mental health effects of the pandemic






Figure: Symptoms of major depression (PHQ-9) by age groups.




Figure: Generalised anxiety disorder (GAD-7) symptoms by age groups.






Figure: Mental health issues, by age groups and panel survey waves (from December 2020 until May 2021)






Figure: Loneliness as a source of stress, self-reported by age groups and panel survey waves
