#### YOUTH MOBILITY

# • The Council of Europe:

- Political panEuropean organisation
  47 member states + observers + other partners
- Promotes: international co-operation, dialogue and peace
- 3 pillars: democracy, human rights and the rule of law





- The Council of Europe Youth sector:
- Supports the active role of young people in society (co-management)
- Intergovernemental co-operation
- Training and educational activities
- Two European Youth Centres
- European Youth Foundation
- Partnership between the EC and the CoE
- Partial Agreement on Youth mobility through the Youth Card





- What is a Partial Agreement?
- A Special programme with its own activities and budget
- Choice of member States to join
- Own budget, programme and working methods





#### YOUTH MOBILITY

- The Partial Agreement on Youth Mobility through the Youth Card:
- Open Partial Agreement



 Member states: Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Cyprus, Finland, Hungary, Ireland, Luxembourg, Malta, Moldova, Montenegro, The Netherlands, North Macedonia, Portugal, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland



#### YOUTH MOBILITY

• Created in 1991



- Committee of Ministers' Resolution ResAP(1991) revised in 2003 as Resolution ResAP(2003)1
- The Statutes: "The Partial Agreement shall be aimed at developing the Youth Card scheme, particularly at European level in the best interests of young people [...] with a view to facilitating their mobility as well as their access to the various goods and services necessary for their personal and cultural development."



#### YOUTH MOBILITY

- Aims:
- Development of the Youth Card Scheme
- Development of inter-governmental co-operation in the field of youth mobility and related issues

To develop better youth policies with and for member Governments





- Youth Card Scheme:
- Anyone under 30



- Access to advice, discounts and benefits
- In the fields of mobility, accommodation, culture, language courses, services and products
- Both on-line and off-line
- In one own's country and in Europe



- European Youth Card Association EYCA
- Non-profit
- Founded in 1987



- Represents over 40 national member organisations
- 38 countries
- Over 7 million cards in use

## • Example

- "Mental Health in digital environments: the role of the European Youth Card in supporting a resilient generation" 18 October 2021 in co-operation with Slovenia
- Aims:
- to ensure mental health is promoted as a policy priority at national and European levels;
- to offer a space for professional and young people to coordinate their positions and make recommendations to policy makers;
- Identify how the European Youth Card infrastructure and resources can be used to raise awareness and destigmatise mental health issues
- Participants: governments, experts, social/youth workers, researchers, EYCA member organisations, youth NGOs, young card holders

# YOUTH MOBILITY



- The Board of Coordination:
- 8 representatives of member states
- 8 members of the European Youth Card Association
- 1 representative appointed by the Advisory Council on Youth
- Oversees the programme of activities, implemented in co-operation with EYCA
