WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The overall goal of this meeting on general aviation is to reduce illegal trafficking, and to prevent the abuse of general aviation traffic through improved control, risk management profiling, detection, and investigative measures. This can be accomplished by assessing risks, raising awareness, exchanging information, sharing best practices, and networking through multidisciplinary co-operation.

AGENDA

This years' agenda will consist of a training session on methods to detect suspicious flights and the inspection of business aircraft in search of illicit drugs. This training will take place by means of a pre-recorded film production in combination with expert speakers who will further explain the different topics and give the opportunity to participants to ask questions.
