Aim and objectives of the study session “**Active Peace - Students Strengthening Peace through Human Rights Education**”

Aim: The study session aims at understanding acts of non-physical violence as infringements of peace and enabling young students to protect peace and promote peacebuilding through Human Rights’ education in their respective societies or milieus;

Objectives:

- to get to know or to deepen the **understanding of Human Rights** through Human Rights Education;
- to analyse the **interrelatedness between non-physical violence** (e.g. discrimination, exclusion, hate speech either online or offline, gender-based violence...) and **peace infringements** and how non-physical violence can lead to violence;
- to reflect the **causes and consequences** of peace infringements from a Human Rights’ perspective and learn to recognize them in our daily life;
- to develop sustainable **concepts of peacebuilding** through Human rights Education to overcome peace infringements;
- to create **safe spaces** where you can express yourself without facing (non-) physical violence within the StS but also in our daily lives, communities and realities
- to communicate the **responsibilities and duties young** Christian people in Europe have in regard to peacebuilding and take action on peacebuilding;
- to engage the participants and other young people of the participants’ milieus to **re-establish peace**;
- to experience **intercultural dialogue and intercultural learning** among the participants.
- to see the **peacebuilding from the Catholic Church’s** perspective;
