Aim and objectives of the study session "Advancing at constructing Safe Learning Space in Non-Formal Education"

Aim: The aim of this study session is to increase the quality of non-formal education and human rights education in participating organisations, by raising awareness, sharing practises and increasing competencies of trainers, educators and youth workers for safe space development.

Objectives:
