The seminar brings together youth workers and specialists working with young people of Ukraine to deepen the understanding and share practice about the role of youth work in addressing the emotional and mental health challenges affecting young people caused by the armed aggression of the Russian Federation against Ukraine.

Objectives of the seminar:

- To analyse the current challenges and needs of young Ukrainians in terms of emotional and mental well-being as a result of the armed aggression of the Russian Federation.
- To share existing practices and expertise in youth work with young people affected by traumatic events.
- Share and discuss the results and expertise of the <u>Youth for Democracy in Ukraine:</u>

 <u>Phase III</u> project on <u>trauma-informed youth work</u>.
- To propose recommendations for youth work with young people facing emotional and mental health issues due to military conflict and related crimes.

- Youth workers and representatives of youth centres working with young internally displaced persons (IDPs) affected by traumatic events during war time in Ukraine.
