

#### **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS**

# Session 1: Panel on the walking routes among the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe David WARD-PERKINS

Over the last twenty years, his work has focused on the social and cultural benefits of responsible tourism development, in projects he has led throughout Europe and around the Mediterranean basin. A particular interest, since 2014, has been the impact of walking trails, cycling routes and other sustainable means of discovering culture and landscape. This has led to his involvement with a number of Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe.

His publications also focus on cultural issues, including food and agriculture, community engagement, nature-based tourism and sustainable mobility. He led the drafting of the UNWTO's Handbook on the Marketing of Transnational Themes and Routes; and is the principal author of 'Tourism Routes and Trails' (CABI, 2018).

#### **Session 2: European Projects**

### **Luigi DE LUCA**

After studying semiotics in Bologna, he focused his interests on cultural management. He has worked in theater, cinema, art, museums, libraries, and intercultural dialogue. His current efforts are dedicated to managing cultural heritage from a Euro-Mediterranean territorial cooperation perspective. He directs the Castromediano Museum in Lecce and coordinates the Museum and Library System of the Puglia Region. He is the author of several publications, including: "Culture is Not Enough: Against the Culture Industry for a Community Art" (2024); "The World Factory: Politics and Economics of Culture in the Age of Globalization" (2010); and "The Landing: An Opera for Migrant Humanity" (2013).

#### Session 3: Working Group on "Cooperation"

#### **Luca BRUSCHI**

He has a Degree in Cultural Heritage Studies at University of Parma and a Master Degree in "Manager for tourism development". Since 2004, he has been in charge of the development of the Via Francigena route, working under the management, executive and the media departments. From 2011 to 2013, he worked in Luxembourg as Project Manager for the Joint Program 2011-2013 European Commission/Council of Europe on Cultural Routes. Since 2015 he is the director of the European Association of Via Francigena. Since 2017 he is in charge to coordinate the EAVF scientific working group for the nomination of the Via Francigena as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

In 2022 he was appointed as an expert in the Permanent Committee for the Promotion of Tourism in Italy chaired by the Minister of Tourism and in 2023 he was appointed as an expert for the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and international cooperation concerning the project "Roots and ancestral tourism". Besides being a Specialist in Europen project management, cultural heritage and tourism, he is also a freelance Journalist.

#### Session 4: Panel on cooperation between EAVF members and key stakeholders

#### **Tullia CABALLERO**

Raised in the United Kingdom and Peru before relocating to Italy, her multicultural upbringing laid the foundation for a remarkable career. Graduating with a degree in interpretation and translation, Tullia's fluency in multiple languages and her passion for the great outdoors propelled her into the realm of adventure travel. Her expertise and understanding of Italy's natural landscapes were significantly enhanced during her time at the World Wildlife Fund in Italy where she developed wildlife and nature-based tours, and later, as the Italy product manager for a leading Dutch cycling and walking company.

In 1999, Tullia founded S-Cape Travel Italy. This has since become a leading expert in adventure travel. Known for its self-guided walking and cycling tours in Europe, as well as small active and experiential















groups in Italy. S-Cape Travel has a Travelife Certification, which is a reflection of its commitment to sustainable tourism practices. In 2016, Tullia's reach broadened when she acquired SloWays and established Italian Bike Tours. This channelled her energy to include cycling adventures alongside long-distance pilgrim and walking trails. In addition to her entrepreneurial achievements, Tullia serves as an ambassador and trainer for the Adventure Travel Trade Association. She is also a co-founder of ActiveItaly, a network dedicated to fostering Active and Sustainable Tourism within Italy.

He is a dynamic marketing professional with a background in tourism, currently working as a Marketing Project Manager at the European Travel Commission.
