CEPEJ Artificial Intelligence Advisory Board (AIAB)
Mandate 2024 – 2025**

Following a first mandate the CEPEJ Artificial Intelligence Advisory Board's (AIAB) in 2022 - 2023, the CEPEJ Bureau will appoint five members for the second mandate 2024 – 2025. The CEPEJ Secretariat invites interested and qualified individuals to express their interest to become members.

Who should respond

Experts on Artificial Intelligence (AI) preferably in the field of Justice of different educational and professional backgrounds (law, engineering, statistics, social sciences etc.), able to work in English.

Persons interested in State-of-the-art discussions on the use of AI in the field of justice and in exchange with justice professionals and decision makers of more than 46 countries, mainly from the public sector and courts and other national and international bodies.

Tasks of the AIAB

Monitor the actual emergence of AI systems in the justice sector.

Provide guidance on the implementation of the CEPEJ's European Ethical Charter on the Use of Artificial Intelligence in Judicial Systems and their environment.

Present to the CEPEJ and its working groups the current developments and advise on possible new strategies and concrete actions concerning the use of AI in the justice system respecting fundamental rights.

What the work entails

- Meet up to four times per year of which at least one meeting will be in person.
- Verify the systems proposed for publication in the CEPEJ Resource Centre on Cyberjustice and AI.
- Contribute to the development of CEPEJ documents with the focus on AI.
- Attend CEPEJ meetings, participate in or moderate discussions, give advice and/or report on relevant activities.
- Attend occasionally national and international meetings to speak about specific aspects of AI within your competence.

The mentioned tasks are not remunerated. Travel and subsistence costs are reimbursed in case they occur in line with the rules and regulations of the Council of Europe.

Required documents

- A CV highlighting relevant work experience clearly indicating past and current employers and clients as well as potential affiliations with (professional) associations and interest groups.
- A list of relevant publications, projects, or other works (if not already evident from the CV).
