









Global cinema admissions decreased 8.8% to 4.8 bn in 2024. Box office revenues reached EUR 28 bn.




Helped by local productions, cinemas in Europe performed relatively better, reaching 839 m admissions, down only -2,1% compared to 2023.




Poland's theatre admissions saw a greater decrease than the entire European market.




Global admissions in 2024 represented a 32% shortfall compared to 2019 figures.





Europe is performing generally better, currently at a 74% recovery rate.



Despite a decline in 2024, Poland has demonstrated a stronger recovery from the pandemic than the European average.











02 Theatrical infrastructure

Global screen count is on the rise, despite notable disparities between individual markets.




India and Latin America maintain relatively low screen density compared to other leading global markets.




Around three quarters of all screens in Europe are located in just ten countries.

Number of screens in Europe, by country in 2024.





Despite having fewer screens than Poland, the Czech population has access to twice as many screens as the Polish population.

Screen density and per capita admissions appear to be closely linked across Europe, with France and Ireland leading in both areas.






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Cinema tickets in Poland are, on average, among the most affordable in Europe.



Poland, despite a lower number of screens per capita than other European countries, registered the second highest number of admissions per screen in Europe


Number of admissions per screen in Europe, by country in 2024






03 Market shares and top films

European films in Europe accounted for 33% of all admissions in 2024, the highest share in 4 years (10, excluding the atypical 2020 theatrical year).




Non-national European films in Europe accounted for 28% of all European admissions in 2024, the highest share in 6 years



While American films continued to dominate, two French titles managed to enter the year-end top 20 rankings.


Top 20 films in Europe, in 2024. Ranked by total admissions.




French local breakout hits and British productions together represented 9 out of the top 10 European films in Europe in 2024.



Since the drop in US films in 2020 due to the pandemic crisis, European market shares in Poland have returned to their usual level.




Polish films in Poland accounted for 64% of European admissions in 2024, the highest share since 2021




For the first time since 2018 excluding the pandemic years, a Polish film topped Poland's top 20 films.

Top 20 films in Poland, in 2024. Ranked by total admissions.




Most biggest European films in Poland were Polish films, followed by British and French films.






04 Film production


Film production in Europe reached an all-time high in 2024, with over 2 500 feature films produced.



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After a continuous decline since 2021, Polish film production rebounded in 2024 due to a doubling of the number of fiction films produced
