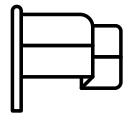

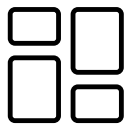
KEY RESULTS IN ARMENIA UNDER PARTNERSHIP FOR GOOD GOVERNANCE III (2023–2027)
