Background info

The Council of Europe is launching the European Year of Digital Citizenship Education 2025 (European Year 2025) to give a new impetus to the development and promotion of digital citizenship education in all member states.

The European Year 2025 stands as a unique opportunity to enhance the visibility and impact of digital citizenship education and reaffirm its value. This designated year should provide a strategic platform for key stakeholders from the public, private and civil sectors to work together, set common goals and share sense-making practices. It will provide a concise yet impactful space for measuring achievements and collectively defining a road map for the future of digital citizenship education. Through streamlined efforts, this initiative is expected to propel DCE forward, ensuring its resilience and effectiveness in the ever-evolving digital landscape.

Three big international conferences will be organised within the framework of the European Year 2025:

- 1. **23-24 January 2025, Strasbourg, France Launch conference** with the objective of deepening the understanding of digital citizenship education and further promoting the take-up by member states;
- 27-28 May 2025, Strasbourg, France Digital Citizenship Education Forum with the objective of enhancing international collaboration and stakeholder engagement in formal, informal and nonformal fields of education;
- 3. **18-19 November 2025, Ljubljana, Slovenia The Way Forward Conference** with the objective of defining new priorities and agreeing on the road map for the future of the digital citizenship education in Europe and beyond.

Objective

The objectives of the European Year are to:

- Raise public awareness of the importance of DCE in enabling learners of all ages to live in a digitally enriched world;
- Increase understanding of the importance of competences for a democratic culture, and ways that they can be developed online;
- Promote the take-up of and define a road map for the future of DCE;
- Link the work of the Council of Europe with that of other organisations, in particular UNESCO and the EU, on digital education, digital literacy and on the use of emerging technologies (including Artificial Intelligence) in education;
- Contribute at the level of the European region to the UN agenda on SDG4 and the global initiatives launched by the Transforming Education Summit concerning the digital transformation of education;
- Motivate key stakeholders in public, private and civil sectors within education to work together towards common goals and shared vision.

The launch conference

The objective of the launch conference is to deepen understanding of the integrated approach to digital citizenship education, to promote the take-up of the European Year by all the member states, as well as to enhance strategies for addressing the challenges from political, educational and cultural perspectives.

A wide range of target groups and sectors is invited to participate in the launching conference including Government representatives, experts, educational practitioners, media, tech industry representatives, youth representation bodies, parents' unions, youth, parents and carers as well other stakeholders from the digital education field.
