1. include in the management plan currently in preparation specific provisions dedicated to climate change and how to address this issue in relation to the long-term conservation of threatened or rare species;

2. abstain from any extension of forest and mountain roads and consider dismantling some of these roads, and abstain from installing additional infrastructure in the park, including wastewater pipes. If no alternative solution exists, infrastructure should be developed on the existing forest roads;

***There are plans to connect the buildings in the Kührointalm area to the public energy, drinking water, and sewage systems. The route for a section of the pipeline has not yet been decided. However, it is clear that the pipelines are to be laid exclusively along existing forest roads.***

3. continue negotiating with landowners and tenants for the replacement of forest grazing by light grazing;

4. search, together with the competent authorities, for alternative locations for the police training centre, and at least abstain from further expansions of it, and continue negotiations with the army to reduce the impact of the army training ground to a minimum;

5. conduct a scientific study on the red deer population and game regulation, including the plausibility of winter enclosures to gain enough data for future management;

***The research projects on the interactions of wild ungulates with their environment have been continued. In a constant monitoring effort ten male red deer have been equipped with new radio collars. In the project focusing on chamois 30 animals have been collared in total. The first results on red deer habitat use have been published in a peer reviewed scientific journal (<https://doi.org/10.1002/wlb3.01424>)***

6. conduct a study on invasive alien species and develop a strategy on how to react to the arrival of these species;

7. ensure that the park administration keeps remains responsible for hunting at regional level;

8. secure an adequate budget and staffing for the park administration to enable effective and efficient management;

***The funding is the responsibility of the Bavarian State Ministry for the Environment and Consumer Protection. The national park's budget is sufficient and secure. However, financial shortfalls have currently led to a reduction in the scope for action for further development.***

9. limit the spotlights of the Jenner cable car to reduce light pollution and consider the construction of a path that is accessible for people with disabilities and a viewpoint next to the mountain station of the Jenner cable car;

***The only lighting on the Jennerbahn that is still in operation during the night is outside the national park. There, lighting on the pylons was approved during the planning of the railway as an "promotional" measure." This lightning is switched off at midnight in summer and at 10 p.m. in winter.***

10. pursue consequently the conversion of spruce forests into mixed forests, using natural processes and disturbances, for example bark beetle and wind fall areas as foreseen in the new conceptual framework, without enlargement of the bark beetle control zone;
