# Partnership for Good Governance

# Project: Preventing and fighting economic crime in Azerbaijan

This project seeks to continue to promote the Council of Europe and international standards in the field of countering economic crime, as well as to build the capacity of Azerbaijani national stakeholders to foster measures for preventing and fighting corruption, money laundering, and terrorist financing, as well as for the recovery of assets in line with international standards addressing recommendations by monitoring institutions.

This project is implemented within the third Phase of the joint programme of the European Union and the Council of Europe "Partnership for Good Governance" running from 2023 until 2026. It builds on the results of the previous phases of the Partnership for Good Governance in the field of countering economic crime (Phase I 2015-2018 and Phase II 2019-2023).

### What are the objectives?

To enhance capacities of national authorities to effectively apply measures to counter corruption, money laundering and terrorist financing, and recover proceeds from crime in Azerbaijan.

#### How does the project work?

Through a combination of tailored policy/legislative, capacity-building and awareness raising actions.

## What is the budget of the project?

#### What do we expect to achieve?

- Improved mechanisms and capacities for effective corruption prevention;
- Enhanced anti-money laundering, countering terrorism financing and asset recovery measures.

#### What is the project duration?

The project runs from 1 March 2023 to 28 February 2026.

The overall Programme budget is EUR 19.3 Mio. (80% is co-funded by the European Union and 20% by the Council of Europe).
