Objectives	The webinar will aim at presenting the international standards on collection and handling of e-evidence as covered by Electronic Evidence Guide and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) developed by international experts under the framework of capacity building projects implemented by the Council of Europe.
	Moreover, the training programmes developed by European Cybercrime Training and Education Group (ECTEG) and Interpol will be introduced as to emphasis the international best practices to facilitate the reinforcement of capacities of Law Enforcement agencies on digital evidence.
	During the webinar participants will be encouraged to share their views on the national regulations and best practices for collecting e-evidence and the training requirements as to develop sustainable skills and competence at domestic level.
Expected outcomes	 Learn about international standards and best practices to be followed by the first responders to the collection of electronic evidence. Increase knowledge on the procedures of collection, seizing, transporting, analyzing and presentation of the e-evidence to Courts. Learn more about the capacities required for specialized computer forensic units dealing and international training programmes available for Law Enforcement agencies.
Background	During the past years, CyberSouth delivered a number of regional workshops and training courses to which representatives of Lebanon authorities participated. Also, other partners/projects in Lebanon offered and will continue to offer training courses on an ad-hoc basis on cybercrime and electronic evidence.

	Given that one of the focus areas of CyberSouth project is the strengthening of cybercrime units, the Council of Europe promotes a strategic approach to training to develop sustainable skills and competence at domestic level.

	This online meeting will be an opportunity to summarize the history of our support, to discuss available resources and the way forward for the next activities on this topic.
