Conditions:

Condition #1: Abandon definitively the scheme to build a dam on the Danube at Dürnstein, as well as a similar scheme within and immediately downstream from the area covered by the diploma:

Since the Wachau has received the European diploma this condition has been fulfilled. There are no plans whatsoever regarding the constructions of dams on the Danube in the Wachau.









Recommendations:

1. guarantee a sustainable budget for the managing authorities to ensure that the management plan can be fully implemented without relying on financial resources from projects;

The management staff as well as the core projects are financed by yearly contributions of the Republic of Austria, the responsible department of the Office of the Lower Austrian Federal Government and the membership fees of the Welterbegemeinden Wachau association.

encourage the setting up of a long-term institutional management framework for the Wachau 2. **Protected Landscape and Jauerling-Wachau Naturpark**

The Wachau Protected Landscape (www.weltkulturerbe-wachau.at/en/) as well as the Naturpark Jauerling (www.naturpark-jauerling.at) both have implemented a long-term institutional management framework.

3. ensure the implementation and updating of the management plan in a participatory way; An extensive evaluation is considered for 2022, at the earliest (5 years Management Plan Wachau World Heritage), together with stakeholders of the European Diploma area.

4. continue the good practice of a global approach to forestry and wild-game management (including co-operation with managing authorities in bordering administrative entities);

No major changes to the previous year. The positive co-operation with these institutions is ongoing.

continue the good practice of maintenance and reconstruction of terrace vineyards; 5.

continue efforts to preserve the apricot orchards; 6.

7. develop an integral approach to tourist management;

Due to the ongoing Corona pandemic the current touristic campaign is focused on sustainable outdoor activities such as hiking and biking alonaside the cultural landscape of the Danube.

8. explore optimal solutions for preserving the appearance of the landscape (colors of the protection nets and barriers against rockslides, light pollution and Christmas tree plantations); No changes to report.

9. use the European Diploma logo more regularly on publications and appropriate infrastructure, promote the European Diploma more actively, encourage partners and stakeholders to use the European Diploma logo.

The big reconnection project LIFE+Wilderness Wetland Wachau (LIFE+ Auenwildnis Wachau) was enlarged until the end of the year 2022. However, the construction work for the 1,6 km long sidearm started in autumn 2020. Nearly 1 km side arm is already digged out.

The Danube islands near Schönbühel (20 ha) became nature conservation areas this year. Also, the island Pritzenau near Rossatz (over 30 ha) should become nature conservation in the next years. At the moment construction works for the side arm are being done.

The restoration of autochthonous alluvial forests has also been continued. Until now 5100 Black Poplar were planted in the region and 20.000 of neophytes like Robina, Acer negundo and Ailanthus altissima were reduced. 40 breeding ponds for amphibia especially Bombina bombina and Triturus dobrogicus have been created within the last years, 7 more ponds will be realized in Rossatz this winter.
