



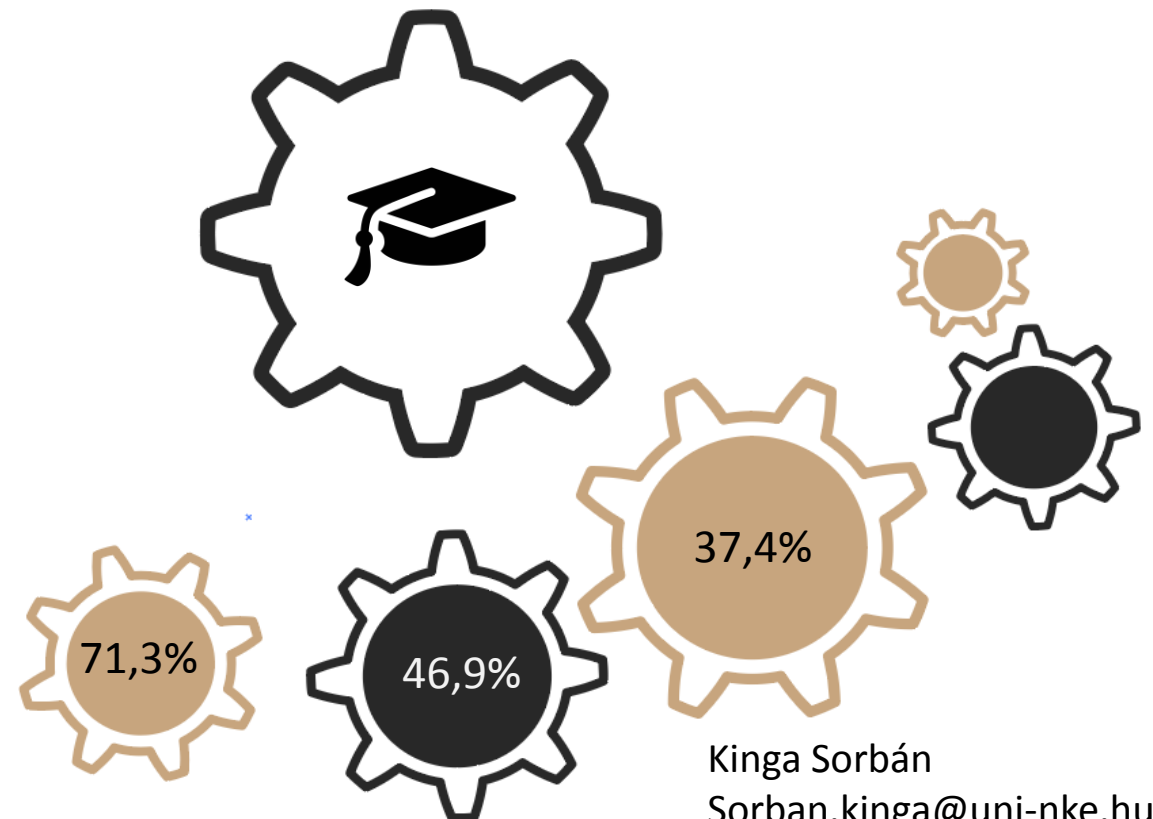
Digital literacy in Eastern Europe

2019: A representative survey conducted by the Institute for Information Society at the National University of Public Service Hungary

Research shows there is a pressing need for digital literacy education in order to raise awareness and educate people about prevention.

- 71,3 % of parents in Hungary doesn't use filtering software to protect their children online.
- 46,9 % never changed their privacy settings on Facebook, yet 41,8% feels that their data are not protected at all on the platforms and an additional 29,7% feels that their data is not very well protected.
- People are generally not very well educated about crimes in cyberspace. Majority of the people doesn't know bitcoin or thinks its illegal, while 37,4% of Hungarians think that it is unlawful to make bank transfers outside the EU.

The same survey is being conducted in the V4 region and will be finished by December.



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
